ORDINANCE NO. 440

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A SECONDARY SEWER TREATMENT PLANT; PROVIDING FOR THE METHODS OF CONSTRUCTION; PROVIDING FOR PAYMENT OF THE COSTS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Sanitary Authority of the State of Oregon has heretofore conducted an investigation of the water pollution of the main Willamette River and having conducted a public hearing concerning such matters on the 22nd day of September, 1960, at which the City of Canby was represented, and thereafter made a record of its findings of fact, a copy of which was duly served on the City of Canby, and

WHEREAS, based on the findings of fact the Sanitary Authority for the State of Oregon entered an Order In The Matter of Sewage and Waste Disposal by Municipalities and Corporations into the Public Waters of the Lower Willamette River of the State of Oregon, which Order was dated the 30th day of September, 1960; and according to such Order, the City of Canby, among others, was directed to abate the pollution of the lower Willamette River by providing in accordance with a prescribed schedule, secondary treatment and effective chlorination, or equivalent, for all domestic and municipal sewage effluence discharged by said City into the Willamette River, now therefore, in accordance with the said Order of the Sanitary Authority of the State of Oregon,

THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That the City Council for the City of Canby, Oregon shall cause to be constructed on City property at the site of the present sewer treatment plant a secondary sewer treatment plant with all appurtenances necessary, useful or convenient, and as may be reasonably necessary for the effective treatment of all sewage effluence discharged by the

City into the Willamette River, and as may be required to comply with the Laws of the State of Oregon and the rules and regulations of the Oregon State Sanitary Authority relating to pollution of water.

Section 2: That the said secondary sewer treatment plant shall be constructed according to the plans and specifications previously prepared by the City Superintendent and which have already been approved by the Oregon State Sanitary Authority and the Canby City Council.

Section 3: That the City Council shall provide by Motion of the Council for the construction of such secondary treatment facilities by either contract or city construction method or the combination of both. Any contractauthorized by the council pertaining to such construction shall be deemed a contract authorized by this Ordinance and as required by the provisions of Section 2, Chapter XII of the City Charter.

Section 4: That the total costs for the construction of said secondary sewer treatment facilities shall be paid from funds currently budgeted by the City for such purpose, and which are now on hand in the SEWER SINKING FUND, which was created by Ordinance No. 409 adopted by the Canby City Council March 3, 1958.

Section 5: It being deemed by the Canby City Council that an emergency exists, and that it is to the best interests of the residents of the City of Canby, and essential for the preservation of the peace, health, safety and general welfare of said residents that this Ordinance take effect immediately, it shall take effect immediately upon its final passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Passed on its first reading at a regular meeting of the Canby City Council this 18th day of December, 1961; ordered posted in three (3) public and conspicuous places for a period of two (2) full calendar weeks as provided by the City Charter, and

to come up for final reading and action of the City Council at a regular meeting thereof to be hald on the 15th day of January, 1962.
