ORDINANCE NO. 502

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING CHARGES FOR RECONNECTING UTILITY SERVICE.

THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: If any utility service now or hereafter furnished by the City of Canby pursuant to an Ordinance, including though not exclusively water, electricity or sewer, is disconnected by the City for failure of the customer to pay the prescribed charges for such service, or to abide by the established rules and regulations of the City pertaining to such utility service, the following charges shall be made and collected by the City before reconnecting the service:

The full amount of the utility bill due at the time the service was disconnected plus the following additional service charge:

- (a) Ten Dollars (\$10.00) if reconnection of the service is requested to be made between the hours of 8:00 o*clock A.M. and 4:00 o*clock P.M. on any day except Saturday, Sunday or a Legal Holiday.
- (b) Thirty Dollars (\$30.00) if reconnection of service is requested to be made at any other time, or on Saturday, Sunday or a Legal Holiday.

Section 2: The contrary provisions of Rules 12 and 13 of Ordinance No. 313 as amended and of Rules 12 and 13 of Ordinance No. 314 as amended are hereby amended to conform to the provisions of this Ordinance; and the provisions of any other Ordinances or parts of Ordinances which are inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 3: This Ordinance shall become effective at 8:00 o'clock A.M. May 1, 1967.
