## ORDINANCE NO. 536

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT FOR WATER STORAGE RESERVOIR.

WHEREAS, the qualified legal voters of the City of Canby approved a Charter Amendment at a special City election duly and legally called and held on November 3, 1970, for the purpose of authorizing the issuance and sale of general obligation bonds of the City in the sum of \$440,000 for the purpose of improving the City's water distribution system and to acquire additional water storage facilities, including necessary land and other **p**roperty necessary for improvements of the water distribution system; and

WHEREAS, the Canby City Council has proceeded to issue and sell the bonds authorized for the said purposes and employed the engineering firm of Clark & Groff Engineers, Inc. of Salem, Oregon, to prepare the plans and supervise the construction of the City's water distribution system improvement project, and one phase of the project involves the construction and erection of a ground storage water reservoir, and bids for the same were publicly called for the time and in the manner required by law, and received and publicly opened by the Canby City Council on April 5, 1971; and

WHEREAS, the bids received for the construction of said improvement were examined by the City Council and its engineer, and the lowest, which was also an acceptable bid, was that of Charles S. Lewis, Jr. of 1317 N. E. Lombard Street, Portland, Oregon, for a total construction and contract cost of \$89,000, which would provide for the construction and erection of a 2.4 million-gallon capacity, 90-foot diameter by 50-feet high steel ground storage reservoir, which includes vinyl painting inside the reservoir; and

WHEREAS, the low bidder is ready, willing and able to proceed with the construction contract in accordance with the plans and specifications for the said improvement project, and it is necessary that a formal written Contract be approved and executed by the

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contractor and the City, NOW, THEREFORE,

THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That the bid proposal of Charles S. Lewis, Jr. of Portland, Oregon, for the construction and erection of a 2.4 million-gallon capacity steel ground storage reservoir for the City's water utility system according to the engineer's plans and specifications for said project and for the total contract amount of \$89,000, be and the same is hereby approved; and the Mayor and City Recorder are hereby authorized and directed to make, execute and deliver in the name of and on behalf of the City of Canby an appropriate Construction Contract with Charles S. Lewis, Jr.

Section 2: The construction costs and contract charges shall be paid as they accrue and when approved for payment by the engineering firm of Clark & Groff Engineers, Inc. from the proceeds of the sale of the City's water bonds now on deposit in the special account called the "WATER DEPARTMENT CONSTRUCTION ACCOUNT" which was created by the Council's Resolution No. CVI adopted December 21, 1970.

<u>Section 3</u>: It being deemed by the Canby City Council that an emergency exists, this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final reading and passage by the Canby City Council.

Passed on first reading of the Canby City Council at a special meeting thereof on the 8th day of April, 1971; ordered posted as provided by the Canby City Charter and to come up for final reading and action of the Canby City Council at a special meeting thereof to be held on the 26th day of April, 1971, at the hour of 7:30 o'clock p.m., Oregon Daylight Saving Time, at the Canby City Hall.
