

ORDINANCE NO. 575

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE PURCHASE OF EIGHT MOTOR VEHICLES AND A STREET SWEEPER FOR THE CITY OF CANBY; ACCEPTING BIDS FOR SALE; DIRECTING EXECUTION OF PURCHASE AGREEMENTS; PROVIDING FOR PAYMENTS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Canby has heretofore advertised for and received bids for sale to the City of eight (8) separate motor vehicles and a street sweeper in accordance with specifications prepared by the City Administrator and previously approved by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, bids as advertised were publicly opened at the Canby City Hall at 2:00 p.m. on Thursday, September 27, 1973; and

WHEREAS, the City Administrator has considered the bids received for said equipment and has made report to the Mayor and City Council on his findings and determinations and recommendations, and the same were considered by the City Council at a regular meeting thereof on October 1, 1973, and the low bids for each item were approved and accepted having been found to be in conformity with the bid call which was published in two successive issues of The Canby Herald, i.e., September 12, 1973, and September 19, 1973; now, therefore,

THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The bids of the following companies and for the respective items as indicated and for the bid prices as indicated are hereby accepted:

Section 2. That the Mayor and City Recorder for the City of Canby shall cause to be executed over their respective signatures a Purchase Agreement between the City of Canby and each of the successful bidders as indicated in the foregoing Section No. 1 and which said contracts shall provide, among other things, for the cash payment of the purchase price for each item of equipment as bid and now accepted and within thirty (30) days after delivery and providing that each item of equipment as delivered conforms to the specifications and details of the bids advertised, tendered and accepted.

Section 3. That payment of the purchase price for the eight separate items of motor vehicles be paid from funds on hand or to be received for the current budget and which have been appropriated in the current budget for the purchase of said equipment; and that the payment of the purchase price for the street sweeper be paid from funds on hand or to be received from Federal Revenue Sharing Funds and which are reflected in and appropriated by the City's Supplementary Budget approved September 17, 1973; but no payment to any of the successful bidders shall be made until such time as the City Council votes its approval and acceptance of the equipment purchased.

Section 4. All Ordinances, or parts of Ordinances, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect at 12:01 a.m. on Tuesday, November 6, 1973.
