

ORDINANCE NO. 650

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING CONTRACT FOR IRRIGATION SYSTEM
FOR MAPLE STREET PARK, PHASE II; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the City of Canby has heretofore advertised for and received a bid for an irrigation system for Maple Street Park, Phase II. An Invitation to Bid was published in the Canby Herald on September 27, 1978, and also in the Daily Journal of Commerce on September 28, 1978. Nine prospective bidders obtained plans but only one bid was submitted and opened at 2:00 o'clock P.M., on October 17, 1978, at the Canby City Hall. Such bid was made by Willow Bend, Inc. and Earl A. Bloomberg, a Joint Venture. The basic bid was for \$9,712. Alternative No. 1 would cost \$1,881; and Alternative No. 2 would cost \$4,193; and

WHEREAS, Alternate No. 1 would provide an irrigation system using quick-couplers, and such a system would require sprinklers to be set manually and the ballfield and other areas to be watered in portions with the use of a hose; and

WHEREAS, Alternate No. 2 would provide a completely automatic system for the entire Phase II area; and

WHEREAS, the Canby City Council as the City's Contract Review Board, met in regular session on November 1, 1978, and considered the bid and reports and recommendations of the City Engineer, and unanimously determined and declared by motion that an emergency exists because of the lateness of the season; further more, it is desirable to have an automatic irrigation system for Phase II; now therefore,

THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:


Section 1: The Mayor and City Recorder are hereby authorized and

directed to make, execute and deliver in the name of the City of Canby, and on its behalf, an appropriate contract with Willow Bend, Inc. and Earl A. Bloomberg, a Joint Venture, for an irrigation system for Maple Street Park, Phase II, according to the plans and specifications for said project as prepared by the City's Engineer and Superintendent of Public Works, and the amount of such contract is the bid quote of \$13,905.

Section 2: The contract price shall be paid upon receipt of billings and completion of the work and upon approval by the City Engineer and City Council from funds on hand which were previously budgeted for completion of the City's North Maple Street Park.

Section 3: An emergency is hereby declared to exist in order that the work may be started and completed as soon as possible during this fall season and before the onset of winter rains and inclement weather. Therefore, this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its enactment after final reading.

Submitted to the Council and read the first time at a regular meeting thereof on Wednesday, November 15, 1978; ordered posted as provided by the Canby City Charter and scheduled for second reading and action of the Canby City Council at a regular meeting thereof to be held on Wednesday, December 6, 1978, at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P.M., at the Council meeting chambers at the Canby City Hall in Canby, Oregon.
