

ORDINANCE NO. 675

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING CONTRACT FOR MAPLE STREET BALL-FIELD LIGHTING PROJECT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Canby is in the process of completing the construction and improvements in the Maple Street Park which is a municipal park in and for the City of Canby; and

WHEREAS, lighting of the ballfield is now required and a substantial part of the cost will be provided by the federal government; and a substantial savings in cost can be obtained if the project is constructed on a time and materials charge basis; and

WHEREAS, the City Council as the City's Contract Review Board considered the matter and the requirements for competitive bids for public contracts and also the reasons for exemptions as set forth in its Ordinance No. 600, and concluded that competitive bidding on this ballfield lighting project is neither required or justified but that quotes should be obtained from qualified contractors; and

WHEREAS, three (3) quotes were solicited and received as follows, and all are based on a time and material charge according to the City Engineer's plans and specifications for the said project:

Beck Electric, Canby, Oregon	\$19,904
Woodburn Electric, Woodburn, Oregon	21,327
Engleman Electric, Woodburn, Oregon	22,424

WHEREAS, the Canby City Council, as the City's Contract Review Board, considered the matter and reviewed the quotes and the recommendations of the City Engineer at a special meeting on March 26, 1980, and agreed to accept the quote of Beck Electric and authorized this ordinance; now, therefore,


THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: The Mayor and City Recorder are hereby authorized and directed to make, execute and deliver in the name of the City of Canby and on its behalf an appropriate contract with Beck Electric of Canby, Oregon, for its construction on a time and material basis of the City's Maple Street Ballfield Lighting Project and for which the City received its quote of \$19,904.

Section 2: The Maple Street Ballfield Lighting Project shall be constructed under the supervision of the City's Engineer and in accordance with his previously prepared plans and specifications for such project; and upon completion of the work the total costs shall be paid upon receipt of billings and approval of the City's Engineer and City Council from the City's Park Construction and Development Fund.

Section 3: An emergency is hereby declared to exist in order that the required work can be started and completed as soon as possible to benefit the City and the residents thereof during the spring baseball season and this ordinance shall therefore take effect immediately upon its enactment after final reading.

Submitted to the Council and read the first time at a special meeting on April 7, 1980, and scheduled for second reading and action of the Canby City Council at a REGULAR meeting thereof to be held on Monday May 7, 1980, commencing at the hour of 7:30 o'clock P.M. at the Council meeting chambers at the Canby City Hall in Canby, Oregon.
