## ORDINANCE NO. 695

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING CONTRACT FOR PURCHASE OF VACUUM SWEEPER

WHEREAS, the City of Canby has heretofore advertised and received bids for its purchase of a self-propelled vacuum sweeper with power suction equipment for cleaning city streets, parks and other public areas, and also plugged drywells; and

WHEREAS, the notice of call for bids was duly and regularly published in the Canby Herald on January 14 and 21, 1981; and

WHEREAS, bids were received as advertised and were opened by the City's Public Works Director on Thursday, February 12, 1981, and the following bids were received:

WHEREAS, the Canby City Council as the City's Contract Review Board, met in regular session on February 18, 1981, and considered the bids and reports and recommendations of the City's Superintendent of Public Works; and the City Council determined that the lowest and best bid was that of Columbia Equipment Co. for its bid F.O.B. Milwaukee, Wisconsin; now, therefore,

THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: The Mayor and City Recorder are hereby authorized and directed

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to make, execute and deliver in the name of the City of Canby and on its behalf an appropriate contract with Columbia Equipment Incorporated of Portland, Oregon, for purchase from it of one (1) new Central Engineering Model ElO-A Vac-all Vacuum Street Sweeper, and Catch Basin Cleaner, complete and mounted on one new Ford C800, or International CO1810, Cab over Chassis (City's Choice), F.O.B. Milwaukee, Wisconsin, for its bid price of \$76,589.

<u>Section 2:</u> There is now \$8,000 in the City's unbudgeted Motor Pool Reserve Fund and the City Recorder is hereby authorized and directed to transfer that amount from that Fund to the City's 1980-81 budgeted Motor Pool Fund and the purchase/ contract price for the above described equipment shall be paid from the City's 1980-81 budget for federal revenue sharing and the Motor Pool Fund to which the Motor Pool Reserve Fund is to be transferred. The payment hereby authorized is to be made upon receipt of billing after delivery of equipment and upon appropriate testing and recommendations of the City's Public Works Department and final approval by the City Council.

Section 3: Inasmuch as the bid specifies a delivery date of approximately 180 days after receipt of order, the Mayor and City Recorder are authorized to place the order immediately upon final reading and enactment of this ordinance and in order to avoid further delays in delivery of the equipment an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its enactment after final reading.

Submitted to the Council and read the first time at a regular meeting on March 4, 1981; ordered posted as provided by the Canby City Charter and scheduled for second reading and action of the Canby City Council at a regular meeting thereof to be held on <u>Wednesday</u>, the <u>lst</u> day of <u>April</u>, 1981,

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commencing at the hour of 7:30 o'clock P.M. at the Council Meeting Chambers at the Canby City Hall in Canby, Oregon.
