ORDINANCE NO. 765

AN ORDINANCE PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF MUNICIPAL ORDINANCES; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Penalties.

- A. Unless otherwide provided, any person violating any of the provisions or failing to comply with any of the mandatory requirements of any ordinance of the City of Canby, is guilty of a misdemeanor. Except where a different punishment is prescribed by any ordinance of the City of Canby, any person convicted of a misdemeanor under the ordinances of the City of Canby shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$2,500.00 or by imprisonment not to exceed one (1) year in the Clackamas County Jail, or both such fine and imprisonment.
- B. Each such person is guilty of a separate offense for each and every day during any portion of which any violation of any provision of the ordinances of the City of Canby is committed, continued or permitted by any such person, and they are punishable accordingly.

Section 2. Emergency. In view of the necessity to prescribe penalties applicable to ordinances of the City of Canby, to promote the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Canby, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final reading Ordinance No. 765 and passage by the Canby City Council.
