

ORDINANCE NO. 838

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY TRAFFIC CODE AND ADOPTING BY REFERENCE THE STATE MOTOR VEHICLE CODE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the State of Oregon has amended certain provisions of the Oregon Vehicle Code, including Chapters 153, 743, and 802 - 823; and

WHEREAS, the City of Canby wishes to adopt by reference said Oregon Vehicle Code as amended, now therefore

THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 10.04.010(A) is amended to read as follows:

10.04.010 Applicability of State Traffic Laws. Violations of provisions in Oregon Revised Statutes Chapters 152, 743 and 801 through 823, inclusive as now constituted, is an offense against the City."

Section 2. Section 10.04.010 (D) is added as follows:


"D. Violations of a provision identical to a state statute is punishable by a fine or imprisonment not to exceed the penalty prescribed by the state statute."

Section 3. Section 10.04.010(B) and 10.04.010(C) and all remaining sections not specifically amended remain in full force and effect.


Section 4. An emergency is hereby declared to exist in order to immediately adopt by reference the Oregon Vehicle Code as recently amended, for the health, welfare, and safety of the citizens of Canby and this ordinance shall therefore take effect

immediately upon its enactment after final reading.
