ORDINANCE NO. 966

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MANUFACTURER'S REBUILD OF THE HI-RANGER UTILITY VEHICLE BY PACIFIC UTILITY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City uses the Hi-Ranger Utility vehicle for multiple jobs in the Streets and Parks Departments, such as changing street lights and trimming tree branches; and

WHEREAS, all Hi-Ranger Utility vehicles must have a major inspection performed after a specific period of time to ensure operator safety and also to ensure that the aerial device is operating properly; and this major inspection must be performed after every 5 years of operation or every 5,250 hours, whichever occurs first.

WHEREAS, the City is desirous of having the Hi-Ranger receive its 5 year rebuild service and any necessary repairs because it has numerous mechanical problems; and

WHEREAS, the City has owned this piece of equipment since 1980, and it has been 7 years since its last servicing; and

WHEREAS, there is only one company, Pacific Utility, certified for servicing this brand of equipment in Portland; and

WHEREAS, Pacific Utility has estimated the manufacturer's rebuild, not including repairs, would be approximately \$23,470; and

WHEREAS, the Canby City Charter requires Council authorization for any contracts exceeding \$15,000;

Section 1. The Mayor and City Administrator are hereby authorized and directed to make, execute and deliver a contract in the name of the City of Canby and on its behalf for the servicing for the manufacturer's rebuild of its Hi-Ranger Utility.

Section 2. In order to effectuate the servicing and repairs of the Hi-Ranger as soon as possible to benefit the citizens of Canby, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final reading and action by the Canby City Council.
