

ORDINANCE NO. 975

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING OPEN OUTDOOR BURNING OF CERTAIN TYPES OF WASTE; PROVIDING A PENALTY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Outdoor Burning of Certain Types of Waste Prohibited.

(1) No person shall kindle, maintain or allow to be maintained, an open outdoor fire, bonfire, rubbish fire or garbage fire; nor shall any person kindle, maintain or allow to be maintained a fire for the purpose of burning grass, wet garbage, plastics, wire insulation, automobile parts, asphalt, petroleum products, including gasoline, petroleum treated materials, rubber products, animal remains or animal and vegetable matter resulting from the handling, preparation, cooking or service of food or any other material which normally emits dense smoke or nauseous odors.

Section 2. Accumulation of Combustible Material a Nuisance.

No person shall accumulate or allow to accumulate combustible materials which in the judgment of the fire marshall constitute a fire hazard. Any such accumulation is a nuisance and subject to abatement as provided in this Code.

Section 3. Enforcement.

Any burning in violation of this Ordinance may be extinguished by the Fire Department or Police Department. Fire Department or Police Department personnel may enter upon the property of persons in order to extinguish any fire burning in violation of this ordinance.

Section 4. Penalty.


Any person, firm or corporation convicted of a violation of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$500.00, to be imposed by the municipal judge of the City of Canby.

Section 5. Emergency Declared.

It being necessary for the health, safety and general welfare of the citizens of

Canby, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its enactment after final reading.




