

ORDINANCE NO. 992

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CANBY MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 2.48 REGARDING PROCEDURES FOR THE OPERATION OF THE CANBY ADULT CENTER, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 2.48.020 is amended to read:

The CAC is organized to responsibly involve all interested citizens of the area in ways that dignify the aging process and enhance the community.

Section 2. Section 2.48.030(A), (C), (D) and (E) is amended to read:

A. To create an atmosphere and provide an opportunity for seniors and disabled persons to get together with their peers.

C. To help seniors live independently and with dignity as long as possible.

D. To provide senior and disabled persons socially enriching experiences which would help preserve their dignity as human beings and enhance their feelings of self worth.

E. To function for all senior and disabled persons in the community, not simply the participants at the center.

Section 3. Section 2.28.040 is amended to read:

A policy advisory board (PAB) shall be appointed to serve in an advisory role to the council. The PAB shall consist of seven members and two ex officio, non-voting members, appointed by the mayor and confirmed by the city council. Such ex officio members shall be the director of the CAC and the chairperson of the Friends of the CAC. Not less than four members shall be residents of the city. No member of the board shall have any financial interest, either directly or indirectly, in any contract to which the CAC is a party, nor shall any such member receive a salary or any payment for materials or for any services rendered the board. Board members may be reimbursed for expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

Section 4. Section 2.48.070 is amended to read:

The duties of the Canby Adult Center Policy Advisory Board shall include:

- A. Developing long-range plans for CAC services and facilities, consistent with city priorities and with state, regional and national standards pertinent to senior centers;
- B. Recommending types of service for the city and its vicinity;
- C. Participating in the annual budgetary process of the city as that process pertains to the CAC;
- D. Encouraging widespread public support and use of the CAC;
- E. Working with the Friends of the CAC to further the purposes of this program;
- F. Performing other duties as authorized by the city council.

Section 5. Section 2.48.090 is amended to read:

Any fees assessed and collected by the city from the rental of the CAC shall be placed in the CAC budget line item to provide for future maintenance and repairs of the center and its equipment.

Section 6. Continuity of Existing Provisions.


The provisions of the Chapter that have not been amended shall remain in full force and effect as stated.

Section 7. Emergency Declared.

It being necessary for the health, safety and general welfare of the citizens of Canby, that procedures regarding the changes in the procedures for the Canby Adult Center be implemented, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its enactment after final reading.

SUBMITTED to the Canby City Council and read the first time at a regular meeting thereof on Wednesday, April 15, 1998, and ordered posted in three (3) public and conspicuous places in the City of Canby as specified in the Canby City Charter and




