

ORDINANCE NO. 1042

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF A SELF PROPELLED ASPHALT PAVER FOR THE STREET DEPARTMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$74,900 FROM WESTERN POWER AND EQUIPMENT, INC. OF PORTLAND, OREGON; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, it is determined that City staff has valid needs, requirements and expectations for a self propelled asphalt paver and that City staff analyzed their asphalt paving needs and properly concluded that the procurement of a self propelled asphalt paver would increase work efficiency and effectiveness, provide substantial cost savings and directly benefit the citizens of Canby; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with ORS Chapter 279 and OAR 125.310-0012(1) of the Public Contracting Law, three written quotes were obtained for a self propelled paver; and

WHEREAS, the City staff selection of the Gilcrest Propaver 813 from Western Power and Equipment, Inc. of Portland is least expensive of the three quotes at \$74,900; and

WHEREAS, the City has budgeted for the asphalt paver in the Street Reserve Department fiscal year 2000 budget (420-420-431-7410); and

WHEREAS, the Canby City Council, acting as the City Contract Review Board, met on March 1, 2000 and considered the purchase of the Gilcrest Propaver 813 from Western Power and Equipment, Inc. of Portland; and

WHEREAS, the City Council determined that the price is fair and reasonable, is in the best interests of the City, and will result in a cost savings to the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Administrator is hereby authorized to purchase the Gilcrest Propaver 813 from Western Power and Equipment, Inc. of Portland for the purchase price of \$74,900.

Section 2. In so much as it is in the best interest of the citizens of Canby, Oregon to have continuous excellent services for the operation and maintenance of the alley and street repairs and to avoid unnecessary added cost to the taxpayers without further delay, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall therefore take effect immediately upon its enactment after final reading.

SUBMITTED to the Canby City Council and read the first time at a regular meeting therefore on March 1, 2000, after the hour of 7:30 PM at the Council Chambers located at 155 SW 2nd Avenue, Canby, Oregon.
