

ORDINANCE NO. 1049

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE CHANGE ORDER NO. ONE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$66,207.53 AND EXTENDING THE CONTRACT TIME BY SIXTY DAYS TO THE CONTRACT WITH DIRT AND AGGREGATE INTERCHANGE, INC. FOR THE 3RD AND BAKER COMMERCIAL/INDUSTRIAL LID PROJECT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, there were a substantial number of conflicts and extraordinary project impacts that directly affected the contractor in the performance of their work pursuant to the contract documents; and

WHEREAS, all contract work and cost conflicts have been resolved between the City and Dirt and Aggregate Interchange, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, all the work under the 3RD and Baker Commercial/Industrial LID project contract is complete and the final work has been accepted; and


WHEREAS, the City Council determined that the change order amount of \$66,207.53 and the contract extension of sixty days are fair and reasonable and all work completed by Dirt and Aggregate Interchange, Inc. was necessary and proper and is acceptable.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute Change Order No. One in the amount of \$66,207.53 and the extension of time by sixty days to the contract dated November 4, 1998 with Dirt and Aggregate Interchange, Inc. for the 3rd and Baker Commercial/Industrial LID project.

Section 2. In so much as it is in the best interest of the citizens of Canby, Oregon to pay for services performed in a timely manner and to avoid unnecessary added cost to the taxpayers without further delay, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall therefore take effect immediately upon its enactment after final reading.
