

ORDINANCE NO. 1051

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF CANBY TO EXECUTE AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH OREGON DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR A TRANSPORTATION AND GROWTH MANAGEMENT PROGRAM GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$95,671 FOR THE CANBY DOWNTOWN REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Canby has applied for a Transportation and Growth Management (TGM) for the Canby Downtown Redevelopment project; and

WHEREAS, all terms and conditions of the Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) are finalized and the agreement is ready for execution by the City ; and

WHEREAS, the total IGA is for \$95,671 and the agreement term ends June 30,2001; and

WHEREAS, the City's match is \$9,482 and the funding of the City's match is in the current Planning Department budget and in the proposed Fiscal year 2000-2001 Planning Department budget; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the City to enter into the proposed IGA for the said TGM grant for the Canby Downtown Redevelopment project and the agreement is necessary, proper and acceptable.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute the Intergovernmental Agreement with Oregon Department of Transportation for a Transportation and Growth Management Program Grant in the Amount of \$95,671 for the Canby Downtown Redevelopment project.

Section 2. In so much as it is in the best interest of the citizens of Canby, Oregon to enter into the said IGA in a timely manner and to avoid unnecessary added cost to the taxpayers for further delay, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall therefore take effect immediately upon its enactment after final reading.

SUBMITTED to the Canby City Council and read the first time at a regular meeting thereon on May 17, 2000, after the hour of 7:30 PM at the Council Chambers located at 155 SW 2nd Avenue, Canby, Oregon.
