## AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF 800 MHZ RADIOS FOR THE CANBY POLICE DEPARTMENT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Clackamas County Police Communications Department (C-Com) is changing its radio system over to 800 MHZ radios under its "800 SmartZone System", and

WHEREAS, in order for the City of Canby Police Department to effectively communicate with C-Com, it is necessary for Canby to purchase 800 MHZ radios, and

WHEREAS, Clackamas County has negotiated a special pricing package through Motorola for the purchase of the radios needed under this "800 SmartZone System", and

WHEREAS, Motorola has agreed to sell to the City of Canby thirteen 800 MHZ radios and one Base Control at the same price per radio as it is selling them to Clackamas County, and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Canby has sufficient funds available in its civil forfeiture account to cover the cost of the purchase of the 800 MHZ radios, now therefore

## THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. The City Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to purchase thirteen 800 MHZ radios and a Base Control at a total cost of \$33,702.44 from Motorola for use by the Canby Police Department.

Section 2. Emergency Declared.

It being necessary for the health, safety and general welfare of the citizens of Canby, that these radios be put to use as soon as possible, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its enactment after final reading.
