ORDINANCE NO. 1150

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT WITH MOTOROLA FOR THE PURCHASE OF MOBILE DATA COMPUTERS AND VEHICLE RADIO MODEMS FOR THE CANBY POLICE DEPARTMENT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Canby wishes to purchase fourteen (14) Mobile Data Computers and four (4) Vehicle Radio Modems for the Canby Police Department; and

WHEREAS, the cost of the equipment will be paid through an Emergency Preparedness Grant from the Federal Government Department of Homeland Security; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with ORS Chapter 279 and OAR Chapter 137 of the Public Contracting Law, four written bids were obtained for the purchase of the mobile data computers and modems as follows; and

1.	Motorola	\$ 86,907.00.
2.	Data 911	\$ 89,824.00.
3.	JLT	\$ 98,384.00.
4.	Panasonic	\$ 110.606.00.

WHEREAS, Motorola submitted the lowest quote of \$ 86,907.00; and

WHEREAS, the City Council meeting and acting as the Contract Review Board for the City of Canby has reviewed this quote and believes it to be in the best interest of the City; now therefore

THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Mayor and City Administrator are hereby authorized and directed to make, execute and declare in the name of the City of Canby and on its behalf, an appropriate contract with Motorola for the purchase of fourteen (14) Mobile Data Computers and four (4) Vehicle Radio Modems for the Police Department for the quoted amount of \$86,907.00.

<u>Section 2</u>. In so much as it is in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Canby, Oregon to provide the Mobile Data Computers and Vehicle Radio Modems to

the Police Department without further delay, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall therefore take effect immediately upon its enactment after final reading.
