

Issue: Annual verification that the City has met the requirements to

receive revenues from intergovernmental taxes.

Background: ORS 221.760 Prerequisites for cities in counties over 100,000

population to receive revenues from cigarette, gas and liquor taxes. (1) The officer responsible for disbursing funds to cities shall disburse such funds in the case of a city located within a county having more than 100,000 inhabitants, according to the most recent federal decennial census, only if the officer reasonably is satisfied that the city meets the requirements or if the city provides four or more of the following municipal services; (a) Police protection, (b) Fire protection, (c) Street construction, maintenance and lighting, (d) Sanitary sewers, (e) Storm sewers, (f) Planning, zoning and

subdivision control, or (g) One or more utility services.

Recommendation: That council adopts Resolution No. 1218 certifying that the city

has met the requirements to receive state-shared revenue money.

<u>Fiscal Impact</u>: The city estimates amounts to be received are \$18,700 for cigarette

taxes, \$258,000 for liquor taxes, and \$923,000 for gas taxes.

### **RESOLUTION NO. 1218**

# A RESOLUTION VERIFYING THAT THE CITY OF CANBY HAS MET THE REQUIREMENTS TO RECEIVE STATE-SHARED REVENUE MONEY.

WHEREAS, ORS 221.760 provides as follows:

Section 1. The officer responsible for disbursing funds to cities under ORS 323.455, 366.785 to 366.820, and 471.805 shall, in the case of a city located within a county having more than 100,000 inhabitants according to the most recent federal decennial census, disburse such funds only if the city provides four or more of the following services:

- 1. Police protection
- 2. Fire protection
- 3. Street construction, maintenance, and lighting
- 4. Sanitary sewer
- 5. Storm sewers
- 6. Planning, zoning, and subdivision control
- 7. One or more utility services and:

**WHEREAS**, City officials recognize the desirability of assisting the state officer responsible for determining the eligibility of cities to receive such funds in accordance with ORS 221.760,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the City of Canby, Clackamas County, Oregon hereby certifies that it provides the following four or more municipal services enumerated in Section 1, ORS 221.760:

- 1. Police protection
- 2. Street construction, maintenance and lighting
- 3. Sanitary sewers
- 4. Storm sewers
- 5. Planning, zoning and subdivision control

This Resolution shall take effect on June 17, 2015.

TAXES FOR THE 2015-2016 FISCAL YEAR.

Issue: Oregon budget law requires adoption of an annual budget by June

30 of each year. ORS 294.453 requires the City to hold a public hearing, and ORS 294.458 requires the City to submit tax

certification documents to the County Assessor by July 15<sup>th</sup>.

ORS 294.456 allows the governing body to amend the budget estimates as long as property tax revenue or rates to be certified is not increased and expenditures in a fund are not increased more

than \$5,000 or 10% whichever is greater.

Background: The City of Canby passed a Tax Base of \$1,250,000 on November

6, 1990. The City passed a local option levy of \$0.49 per \$1000.00 of assessed property value on November 08, 2011 to fund Swim Center operations. The City levies the taxes provided for in the adopted budget at the permanent rate of 3.4886 per \$1000. These taxes are hereby levied upon all taxable property within the district as of 1:00 a.m. July 1, 2015. The allocation and categorization are

subject to the limits of section 11, Article X1 of the Oregon

Constitution.

**RE:** SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET RESOLUTION NO. 1220

<u>ISSUE:</u> Adoption of a Supplemental Budget and appropriating unanticipated funds for the 2014-

2015 fiscal year.

SYNOPSIS: A supplemental budget is required when unanticipated revenues are received and the City

wants to be able to spend or transfer them in the current fiscal year. The other changes in the supplemental budget are changes in appropriations from one budget category to another within the same fund. Such changes can be accomplished by a resolution transfer, but they can also be included in a supplemental budget. Proposed changes do not

increase expenses of any fund by 10% or more.

# **General Fund**

# **Planning**

Traffic Studies are completed as required due to applicable applications received and they are funded by the applicant therefore we are recognizing an excess of both revenue and expense realized and incurred.

# Court

Personnel Services expense in this department is projected to exceed budget due to unanticipated changes in wages and benefits. We are offsetting this with excess fines and bails revenue realized.

# Cemetery

Materials and Services are projected to exceed budget due to increase expenses incurred related to the change in operations as the previous contractor gave notice effective 1/1/2015.

# **Library Fund**

The Library realized unanticipated grant and donation revenues and corresponding expenses.

# **Street Fund**

Increase in capital expense proposed relates to a timing difference in when the 2015 Street Maintenance Program will be completed; this was initiated by a request from the contractor which we are able to accommodate. In addition we have started engineering work on the 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue project which is also budgeted for next fiscal year.

# **Fleet Services Fund**

The increase in capital outlay is related to changes in specifications for the flatbed truck which was budgeted and is being funded by an excess in cash carryover.

# **Transit Fund**

The increase in capital relates to increased costs associated with the bus yard improvements, approved by Council.

# **Swim Center Levy Fund**

Increase relates to additional cost of guards and instructors based on anticipated programing through the end of the year,

# **SDC Fund**

Changes are proposed to recognize transfers for allowable expenses for waste water treatment plant improvements. It is our policy to use the most restricted forms of available revenue first.

# **Sewer Combined fund**

Changes are proposed to offset the transfer out in the SDC Fund.

# **ORDINANCE NO. 1419**

# AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CANBY MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 9.32 DRUG PARAPHERNALIA SECTION 9.32.040 OFFENSES AND PENALITIES AND SECTION 9.32.060 NUISANCE

**WHEREAS**, the City of Canby currently has a Municipal Code, Chapter 9.32 based upon the Model Drug Paraphernalia Act authorized by the Drug Enforcement Administration of the United States Department of Justice; and

**WHEREAS**, the People of the State of Oregon recently voted to legalize (under Oregon State law) the use of recreational marijuana for people over the age of twenty-one years; and

**WHEREAS**, the Canby Municipal Code needed to reflect these recent changes in Oregon law as it relates to drug paraphernalia; now therefore.

# THE CITY OF CANBY, OREGON, ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

1. Section 9.32.040 and 9.32.060 of the Canby Municipal Code are amended to read as follows:

# § 9.32.040 Offenses and penalties.

- A. <u>Possession of Drug Paraphernalia</u>. It is unlawful for any person to use or to possess with intent to use drug paraphernalia to plant, propagate, cultivate, grow, harvest, manufacture, compound, convert, produce, process, prepare, test, analyze, pack, repack, store, contain, conceal, inject, ingest, inhale or otherwise introduce into the human body a controlled substance. Any person who violates this subsection is guilty of an infraction and upon conviction may be fined not more than \$500. As of July 1, 2015, it is a valid defense to this section that a violator of this section is twenty-one years or older at the time of the offense, and that the paraphernalia was solely for uses involving marijuana.
- B. Manufacture or Delivery of Drug Paraphernalia. It is unlawful for any person to deliver, possess with intent to deliver, or manufacture with intent to deliver drug paraphernalia, knowing or under circumstances where one reasonably should know that it will be used to plant, propagate, cultivate, grow, harvest, manufacture, compound, convert, produce, process, prepare, test, analyze, pack, repack, store, contain, conceal, inject, ingest, inhale or otherwise introduce into the human body a controlled substance. Any person who violates this subsection is guilty of an infraction and upon conviction may be fined not more than \$500. As of July 1, 2015, it is a valid defense to this section that a violator of this section is twenty-one years or older at the time of the offense, and that the paraphernalia was solely for uses involving marijuana by others also over the age of twenty-one years.
- C. <u>Delivery of Drug Paraphernalia to a Minor</u>. Any person 18 years of age or over who violates division B. of this section by delivering drug paraphernalia to a person under 18 years of age who is at least 3 years his or her junior is guilty of a misdemeanor offense and upon conviction may be imprisoned for not more than 1 year, fined not more than \$2,5006,250, or both.
- D. <u>Advertisement of Drug Paraphernalia</u>. It is unlawful for any person to place in any newspaper, magazine, handbill or other publication any advertisement, knowing that the purpose of the advertisement, in whole or in part, is to promote the sale of objects

designed or intended for use as drug paraphernalia. Any person who violates this section is guilty of an infraction and upon conviction may be fined not more than \$500.

# § 9.32.060 Nuisance.

A. Drug paraphernalia are public nuisances. Any peace officer who has probable cause to believe these items enumerated above are being possessed in violation of this chapter shall summarily seize any paraphernalia and shall deliver it to the Chief of Police, who shall hold it subject to the order of the Municipal Court. Officers operating under this section should consider the new, valid defenses above as of July 1, 2015.
