<u>Issue:</u> Adoption of a Supplemental Budget for the 2011-2012 fiscal year.

Synopsis: A supplemental budget is required when unanticipated revenues are received and the City wants to be able to spend or transfer them in the current fiscal year. A large FEMA grant that will be passed through to

Canby Utility is one example of changes of this type.

When revenues are not as much as expected, which was the case with Library Fund cash carryover, adjustments to expenditure appropriations

must be made to compensate.

The other changes in the supplemental budget are changes in appropriations from one budget category to another within the same

fund. Such changes can be accomplished by a resolution

transfer, but they can also be included in a supplemental budget.

At the mid-year budget review workshop on January 25, the details of the supplemental budget changes were discussed. There have been a few

additional items added. The detail sheets that explain the line item

changes are attached for your review.

<u>Recommendation:</u> Staff recommends that Council adopt Resolution 1121.

RESOLUTION NO. 1121

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING A SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET FOR THE 2011-2012 FISCAL YEAR

WHEREAS, the City of Canby budget for the 2011-2012 fiscal year was adopted by the City Council at a regular meeting thereof on Wednesday, June 15, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the City of Canby has since received unanticipated revenues and a supplemental budget is required in order to expend those revenues; and

WHEREAS, in order to increase transfers from one fund to another fund a supplemental budget is required; and

WHEREAS, in order not to overspend appropriations in any category of expenditures, it is necessary to transfer appropriations within several funds from certain expenditure categories to other expenditure categories.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

<u>Section 1.</u> The following Supplemental Budget for the City of Canby for the 2011-2012 fiscal year is hereby adopted.
