<u>Issue:</u> Create a no parking zone on the south side of SW 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue beginning

at the intersection of S Birch Street and extending easterly approximately

250-feet.

Synopsis: The Canby Police Department requests the creation of a no parking zone

on the south side of SW 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue beginning at S Birch Street and extending easterly on SW 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue to a point approximately 250-feet

east of S Birch Street due to motor vehicle crashes.

Recommendation: Staff recommends the City Council adopt Resolution 1050 creating

a no parking zone on SW 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue beginning at S Birch Street and extending easterly on SW 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue to a point approximately

250-feet east of S Birch Street.

<u>Rationale</u>

/Background: On October 27, 2009 I received an email (attached) from Officer

Bret Ethington of the Canby Police Department. The message described how the geometry of the intersection at SW 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue at S Birch Street has resulted in several motor vehicle crashes between passenger vehicles and semi-trucks. Officer Ethington's solution to the problem is to create a no parking zone on SW 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue beginning at S Birch and extending approximately 250-feet east. I met Officer Ethington on site and he outlined the issues he described in the email. After reviewing his concerns I find his

solution is warranted.

#### Dwayne,

The Police Department has recently responded to a couple of crashes at the corner of SW 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave and S Birch St, involving passenger vehicles and semi-tractors. This particular roadway is the truck route semis must take in order to access N Elm St from Hwy 99E. The intersection of SW 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave and S Birch St is a less than ideal intersection for these commercial vehicles to take based on the less than 90 degree turn the semis have to make. Added to the complexity of this turn are the student's cars parked eastbound on SW 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave, constricting this small street even more. At times, especially at lunch, are the McDonalds customers who line up in both lanes of SW 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave awaiting their chance at a Happy Meal. This makes SW 2<sup>nd</sup> a nightmare for semi-tractors to access.

To help alleviate this problem, I propose the City makes the south side of SW 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave a No Parking area (from S Birch to the eastside of the High School entrance). This would allow the semi drivers to swing a little wider in making the turn.

Please feel free to contact myself, Sgt. Cunningham or Lt Tro regarding this problem if you feel there are other alternatives to this problem.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 1050**

A RESOLUTION RESTRICTING MOTOR VEHICLE PARKING ON THE S SIDE OF SW 2<sup>nd</sup> AVENUE BEGINNING AT S BIRCH STREET AND ENDING AT A POINT APROXIMATELY 250-FEET EAST OF S BIRCH STREET.

**WHEREAS**, § 10.04.130 of the Canby Municipal Code lists the duties of the Public Works Director related to installation of specific new traffic control devices subject to the approval of the City Council by resolution or motion; and

**WHEREAS**, § 10.04.130 D. of the Canby Municipal Code designates the Director of Public Works designate areas in which no parking shall be permitted; and

**WHEREAS**, the Canby Police Department requests a no parking area be designated on a portion of SW 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue due to several motor vehicle crashes at the intersection of S Birch Street; and

**WHEREAS**, The Director of Public Works inspected the area and finds the creation of a no parking zone to be warranted as requested by the Canby Police Department; now therefore,

#### **IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED** by the City of Canby council as follows:

- 1. That the S side of SW 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue beginning at S Birch Street and extending easterly on SW 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue to a point approximately 250-feet east of S Birch Street be designated as a no parking area by a method approved by the Director of Public Works.
- 2. This resolution shall take effect on December 16, 2009.
