Synopsis: Several years ago the City applied for a Community Development Block Grant

(CBDG) and was awarded funding for the NW Canby Sidewalk Improvement Project. One of the award conditions was the City agreed to contribute twenty percent (20%) of the total cost of the project or all costs for the project which

exceed available CDBG funds budgeted for the project

<u>Recommendation:</u> Staff recommends that the City Council adopt Resolution 1009,

authorizing the Public Works Director to disburse \$30,454.95 to

Clackamas County.

Rationale: The City Adopted an IGA to accept the CBDG Project Funds. The IGA included

language that the City agrees to contribute twenty percent (20%) of the total cost of the project or all costs for the project which exceed available CDBG funds

budgeted for the project

Background: The NW Canby Sidewalk Project included the installation of new sidewalks and

replacement of sidewalks and sidewalk ramps that did not meet ADA

specifications. The project area was bordered on the north by NW 5th Avenue, bordered on the south by NW 2nd Avenue bordered on the east by N Fir Street and on the west by Cedar Street. Parker NW was awarded the construction contract for the project and it was completed in early September of 2008. The total project cost after several change orders was \$228,454.95 of which the City of Canby is

responsible for \$30,454.95.


WHEREAS, the NW Canby Sidewalk Project is complete at a total project cost of \$228,454.95; and

<u>Issue:</u> Authorize Urban Renewal Agency to purchase Klohe Property and Council

intention to reimburse Agency for costs of purchase and construction of

parking lot

Synopsis:

The City of Canby will inherit funds from the Alice Klohe Estate, which includes her residence located at 317 NE Third Street, Canby. The City's portion of the inheritance is approximately \$368,000 which is forty-six percent of the estimated estate value of \$800,000. The Urban Renewal Agency shall enter into a Purchase and Sale Agreement to purchase the residence for the amount of \$315,000. The City, upon receiving its portion of the Klohe estate, will reimburse the Agency for purchase of the property, costs of purchasing, environmental clean-up, demolition, and engineering/construction of a parking lot as part of the Canby Cinema public parking lot project, and construction of a memorial honoring the donation from Mr. and Mrs. Klohe. The memorial will be in the form of a "pocket park" i.e., a tree and bench with a name plaque located on the site.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends the Council adopt the resolution and commitment of inheritance funds.

Recommended motion: "I move to adopt Resolution No. 1010, A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CANBY URBAN RENEWAL AGENCY BOARD TO PURCHASE REAL PROPERTY LOCATED AT 317 NE THIRD STREET, CANBY, OREGON, and record the Council's intention of reimbursing the Agency upon receipt of its inheritance from the Alice Klohe estate for all costs related to purchase of property and construction of a parking lot and memorial."

Background:

The Klohe property is located adjacent to the planned public parking lot and access road to be developed in early 2009 as a critical part of the Canby Cinema project. The purchase of this property falls within the long range plan for the City's downtown revitalization plan by providing needed parking. The City Council on September 17, 2008 gave staff direction to enter into negotiations for the Klohe property and requested that the City Engineer begin work on a proposed design to include the property in the planned parking lot and directed staff to include a memorial for the Klohes.



Financial Impact:

The Urban Renewal Agency has available funds to make this purchase. The anticipated inheritance will be received in approximately seven months.

WHEREAS, City Council finds that it is in the City's best interest to complete the proposed redevelopment project by purchasing this property:

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Canby, as follows:



ORDINANCE NO. 1297

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT WITH WITHNELL MOTOR COMPANY OF SALEM, OREGON FOR THE PURCHASE OF TWO 2009 DODGE CHARGER VEHICLES WITH POLICE PACKAGES FOR THE CANBY POLICE DEPARTMENT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Canby wishes to purchase two new Dodge Charger vehicles with police packages for the City's Police Department; and

WHEREAS, the purchase will be made from Oregon Department of Administrative Services (DAS) in compliance with ORS 279.820 - 279.855 utilizing an existing solicitation for the State of Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) under State of Oregon Bid No. 5159 - PA; and

WHEREAS, DAS concurs with the City of Canby utilizing the existing solicitation and this purchase is in cooperation with the ORCPP; and

WHEREAS, Withnell Motor Company of Salem, Oregon submitted the low bid of Eighty-two thousand, three hundred one dollars and twenty-six cents (\$82,301.26) for two 2009 Dodge Charger vehicles with police packages according to the required specifications of the State of Oregon; and

WHEREAS, the City Council meeting and acting as the Contract Review Board for the City of Canby has reviewed this bid and believes it to be in the best interest of the City to accept such bid; now therefore

THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Mayor and City Administrator are hereby authorized and directed to make, execute and declare in the name of the City of Canby and on its behalf, an appropriate contract with Withnell Motor Company of Salem, Oregon for two 2009 Dodge Charger vehicles with police packages for the bid amount of Eighty-two thousand, three hundred one dollars and twenty-six cents (\$82,301.26).

<u>Section</u> 2. Inasmuch as it is in the best interests of the City of Canby Police Department to put these vehicles into service as quickly as possible, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its enactment after final reading.

Re: Street Maintenance Fee & Sewer Billing Implementation

We have made good progress in implementing the street maintenance fee and City sewer billing. Here are the highlights:

- CUB will continue to bill our sewer charges through their December billing cycles. They bill in four cycles: the first covers (approximately) all of November, the second covers three weeks of November and one week of December, the third covers two weeks of November and two weeks of December, and the fourth covers one week of November and three weeks of December.
- CUB will collect the sewer charges from their final billing (including their usual collection efforts on delinquencies), and remit payments to the City as they have always done.
- On December 30, the City will send out bills for the month of December which will include a street maintenance fee charge for December, and pro-rated sewer charges that align with CUB's four cycles. The pro-rated charges will be 100% for the first cycle, 75% for the second cycle, 50% for the third cycle and 25% for the fourth cycle.
- On January 30 and each month after that, the City will bill street maintenance fees and sewer charges for the entire month. We will not do cycle billing. Each month the billings will go out on or about the 30th of the month and be due on or about the 12th of the following month.
- Notifying customers of the billing change has started and will continue by various means: CUB newsletter, City newsletter, Canby Herald and a letter to commercial customers that will precede the City's first billing.
- I will present more detailed information and answer your questions at the November 5 City Council meeting.
