



City Council Agenda Items for June 2 Council Meeting

- 1. **Communications** As of this writing, I am still waiting for the letter from ODOT regarding their proposed interim plan for the intersection of 99E and Territorial. As the email to the Mayor that was forwarded onto you indicates, I asked for a plan view of the interim intersection configuration to be provided along with the letter. This item is listed on the agenda as a discussion item in response to this expected letter.
- 2. **Consent Agenda**: Nothing remarkable routine approval of minutes and accounts payable.
- 3. Parks & Recreation System Development Charge (Old Business): As you recall, some months ago, the staff brought the Council information about adjustments to Parks SDC's based upon a specific methodology. At that time, the Council asked staff to work with the Homebuilders' Association to address their concerns regarding the methodology and then return to the Council with a recommendation for the adoption of revised Parks SDC's. That process has been concluded by Matilda and attached is a staff report outlining the results of those conversations with the building community.

Matilda will be asking the Council for authority to move forward with the revised Parks SDC's by preparing an ordinance which implements the new SDC's. Attached is Matilda's staff report.

RESOLUTIONS AND ORDINANCES

4. <u>Resolution 860 Re: Verification of Eligibility to Receive Revenues</u> <u>from State Cigarette, Gasoline and Liquor Taxes</u>: This is a routine resolution that must be adopted by the Council each year in order for the City to receive

the above revenues. Attached to the resolution is a staff report prepared by Chaunee.

- 5. Ordinance 1141 Amendment to Article 10 of the Transit Contract with OHAS Re: Maximum Obligation to be Paid to Contractor by the City: This is before you for second reading.
- 6. Ordinance 1142 Re City's Declaration to Elect to Receive State Revenues for FY 2004-2005 This ordinance is required by State Law if the City is to receive State Revenue Sharing from the State of Oregon during the next fiscal year. A similar ordinance is prepared each year as part of the budgeting process. Attached is Chaunee's staff report.
- 7. Ordinance 1143 Re: Amending Zoning Map for Tax Lot 4500 of Tax Map 4-1E-4AA (Netter): This is before you for second reading.
- 8. Ordinance 1144 Re: Authorization of a Contract for Street Resurfacing: This ordinance is before you for second reading. The work has been completed in the Township Village area.
- 9. Ordinance 1145 Re: Purchase of New Dump Truck for the Street Department: This ordinance is before you for second reading.
- 10. Ordinance 1146 Re: Contract with Recreation Resource for the Purchase of Playground Equipment: This ordinance provides for the purchase of playground equipment at the 13th Avenue Park tot lot. The equipment is being purchased under the State of Oregon's cooperative purchasing agreement. Attached is a staff report from Beth Saul on this topic.
- 11. **Manager's Report:** On May 25, a work session was held with the County Commission, County staff and representatives from the City of Canby regarding the Arndt Road alignment and specifically three options under consideration as to where Arndt Road intersects with 99E. In addition to myself, also attending were Curt McLeod, Roy Hester and Planning Commissioners Helbling and Ewert.

The purpose of the work session was for County staff to brief the Commission on three options for the connection of realigned Arndt Road with 99E. As you are aware, John Williams has been in discussions with the County regarding a possible alignment of Arndt Road with 3rd Avenue and Berg Parkway. This alternative removes a significant amount of traffic from the intersection of 99E and Elm and relates directly to improved

I-5 access to 13th Avenue and the industrial park.

The meeting was informational and the pros and cons of the three alternatives were discussed. There is interest with the Commission that the City and County continue to explore the Berg Parkway/Arndt Road alternative and perhaps approach this alternative in a phased manner so as not to miss out on available funding.



Staff met with local builders and a designated representative of the local Homebuilder's Association in February of this year to discuss their concerns with our proposed System Development Charge methodology. After much discussion all agreed on the following minor modifications to the original methodology:

- By law we may include an administrative fee(up to 5% of the SDC calculation) in our methodology. The homebuilders were concerned that the 5% admin fee was excessive for Canby. We agreed to use the \$67.32 figure from our Cost of Services study, which should more accurately reflect the true cost of administering SDC's.
- The second concern was how to monitor implementation of our 20 year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP). We have added language to the methodology that would require the City to review the CIP every 5 years and make any necessary adjustments to insure that implementation was on track. In essence we will expect to implement one quarter of the CIP over each 5 year interval.

These two changes were the only requested modifications to the original methodology. If the Council approves the modifications at the upcoming June 2^{nd} Council meeting, Staff will prepare an implementing Ordinance to be read at the July 16^{th} Council meeting. <u>Issue:</u> Annual verification that the City has met the requirements to

receive revenues from intergovernmental taxes

Background: ORS 221.760 Prerequisites for cities in counties over 100,000

population to receive revenues from cigarette, gas and liquor taxes.

(1) The officer responsible for disbursing funds to cities shall disburse such funds in the case of a city located within a county having more than 100,000 inhabitants, according to the most recent federal decennial census, only if the officer reasonably is satisfied that the city meets the requirements or if the city provides four or more of the following municipal services; (a) Police protection, (b) Fire protection, (c) Street construction, maintenance and lighting, (d) Sanitary sewers, (e) Storm sewers, (f) Planning, zoning and

subdivision control, or (g) One or more utility services.

Recommendation: That council adopts RESOLUTION #860 validating that the city

gas met the requirements to receive revenues from cigarette, gas,

and liquor taxes.

Fiscal Impact: The city estimates amounts to receive \$26,000 for cigarette taxes,

\$115,000 for liquor taxes, and \$650,000 for gas taxes.

RESOLUTION NO. 860

A RESOLUTION VERIFYING THAT THE CITY OF CANBY HAS MET THE REQUIREMENTS TO RECEIVE REVENUES FROM CIGARETTE, GAS AND LIQUOR TAXES.

WHEREAS, ORS 221.760 provides as follows:

Section 1. The officer responsible for disbursing funds to Cities under ORS 323.455, 366.785 to 366.820, and 471.805 shall, in the case of a City located within a County having more than 100,000 inhabitants according to the most recent Federal decennial census, disburse such funds only if the City provides four or more of the following services:

- 1. Police protection
- 2. Street construction, maintenance and lighting
- 3. Sanitary sewer
- 4. Planning, zoning and subdivision control
- 5. One or more utility services
- 6. Storm sewers

And:

WHEREAS, City officials recognize the desirability of assisting the state officer responsible for determining the eligibility of Cities to receive such funds in accordance with ORS 221.760,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Canby, Clackamas County, Oregon hereby certifies that it provides the following four or more municipal services enumerated in Section 1, ORS 221.760:

- 1. Police protection
- 2. Street construction, maintenance and lighting
- 3. Sanitary sewers
- 4. Planning, zoning and subdivision control
- 5. Storm sewers

ADOPTED by the Canby City Council for the City of Canby, Oregon this 2nd day of June 2004.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE 10 OF TRANSIT CONTRACT DATED JUNE 19, 2002, BETWEEN CITY OF CANBY, HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS "CITY" AND OREGON HOUSING AND ASSOCIATED SERVICES, INC. (OHAS), dba WHEELS COMMUNITY TRANSPORTATION, HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS "CONTRACTOR" REGARDING THE MAXIMUM OBLIGATION TO BE PAID TO CONTRACTOR, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, "City" entered into a contract, dated June 19, 2002 with "Contractor" for the purpose of providing bus service for the citizens of the City of Canby, and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the parties to amend Article 10 of said Contract to reflect changes in the maximum obligation to be paid to the Contractor under the current Transit Contract, now therefore

THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Article 10 of the Transit Contract dated June19, 2002 is amended to read as follows:

"CITY agrees to pay Contractor in consideration for the transit services as described in Article 3, Scope of Service. The maximum cost to be paid by CITY to Contractor for all transit service for year one (1) is not to exceed \$337,500.00 and for year two (2), not to exceed \$400,000.00".

<u>Section 2.</u> All other sections, not amended in this Ordinance, shall remain in full force and effect as they presently appear.

Section 3. In as much as it is in the best interests of the citizens of Canby to complete this contract by the end of the fiscal year, 2003-2004, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final reading.

Issue: Purchase of playground equipment for Thirteenth Avenue Park.

Synopsis: As part of the implementation of Phase I of the Thirteenth Avenue

Park master plan a tot lot is planned. The parking lot is near completion, and now staff needs to proceed with the purchase of the play equipment. Ordinance No. 1466 will authorize staff to proceed with this purchase, which is being made off of a State Department of Administrative Services Purchasing Division price agreement number

3227.

Recommendation: Staff recommends that Council authorize the Mayor

and City Administrator to enter into a contract with Recreation Resource as is allowed through the State of Oregon Department of Administrative Services Purchasing Division price agreement by approving

Ordinance No. 1466.

Fiscal Impact: Funds are budgeted in the Park Development Fund for the

implementation of Phase I of Thirteenth Avenue Park. Monies in

this fund may not be used for any other purpose.

Background: Through a public process a master plan was developed for the

Thirteenth Avenue Park, located near Ackerman Middle School. Two-thirds of the park is devoted to soccer fields, developed and maintained through the efforts of Canby Kids Soccer, using nearly

\$30,000 of their own saved and donated funds. Now the

playground/picnic portion of the park is being developed, and the

Street Department has nearly finished the parking lot. The

development of the park is scheduled in phases as park

maintenance is available. Phase I includes the tot lot and parking lot, as well as some donated trees from Hazel Dell Nursery and additional help on tree watering and trail development from Kiwanis. The MOMS club also donated funds for the park.

WHEREAS, in accordance with ORS 279.015 (1)(g), the City of Canby, as a member of the Oregon Cooperative Purchasing Plan, finds that the original contract met the requirements of ORS chapter 279, the contract allows other public agencies to use the solicitation; and the purchase will be placed against State of Oregon solicitation # 3227 in compliance with the State of Oregon Department of Administrative Services Purchasing Division price agreement for this product; and

WHEREAS, Recreation Resource, of Salem, Oregon submitted the low bid in the State Purchasing Division solicitation process; now therefore

THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: The Mayor and City Administrator are hereby authorized and directed to make, execute and declare in the name of the City of Canby and on its behalf, an appropriate contract with Recreation Resource, of Salem, Oregon, for the bid amount of \$74,744.76.

Section 2: Emergency Declared

It being necessary for the health, safety, and general welfare of the citizens of Canby that this equipment be put to use as soon as possible, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its enactment after final reading.
