





AMENDED ATTACHMENT "A" CITY OF CANBY INTERAGENCY AGREEMENT

CANBY SWIM CLUB, INC.

For the budget year 2003-2004 the base cost for operating the Canby Swim Center is \$41.00 per hour. This is the cost to "open the doors." Further, a cost of service study has determined that the cost of servicing the Swim Club is \$15,285 for the year. In Section I, items A through C are options for in-kind service that can be performed to offset the cash portion of this agreement. The Swim Club must notify the City in writing by October 1, 2003 which option(s), if any, they will utilize. The balance will be due in three equal payments October 15, 2003; January 15, 2004; and May 15, 2004.

- I. A. Pool maintenance: Each year the pool closes for extensive maintenance. The Club could provide four people, each subject to the facility manager's approval, for one forty-hour period to assist with this maintenance. This would deduct \$1,280 from the above total.
 - B. Corporate sponsorships: Both the Swim Club and the Swim Center could benefit from cultivating sponsorship opportunities in the community, but the Swim Center staff resources have prevented us from providing the legwork necessary for the support of such a venture. The Club could work with Swim Center staff and the Library and Park Director to develop and implement a plan with resulting revenue divided in some manner agreeable to each party.
 - C. Distribution of schedules: The club could distribute swim schedules to area clinics for their waiting rooms. This would deduct \$8.00 per hour that will be calculated at each payment due date.
- II. The current cost of the copier maintenance contract is: \$950.00. The Canby Swim Club will pay ½ of this amount, or \$475.00, as well as providing their own paper.
- III. The current rate to purchase extra time using the facility is \$41.00 per hour.
- IV. The current wages and benefits for lifeguards is \$10.00 per hour.
- V. The current costs associated with the Columbia Basin Swim League meet will require compensation of \$20.00 per hour. These costs include two lifeguards.

VI. STORAGE SPACE:

The CITY will provide free storage space for the SERVICE AGENCY, as has been done for several years. This storage will be approximately 200 square feet and will be located in a storage shed outside the Swim Center building.

The storage area will be kept neat and orderly by the SERVICE AGENCY. Nothing flammable or of an unsafe nature will be stored. No structural changes can be made to the storage facility without permission of the CITY.

Any keys that are given to the SERVICE AGENCY for access to this building will be the responsibility of the President of the SERVICE AGENCY and will not be given out to anyone other than persons who are authorized to access the storage facility. The Swim Center staff will be provided with a list of authorized persons.

Should the CITY require the storage area for CITY purposes, the SERVICE AGENCY will be notified at least 90 days in advance of the change. The CITY will endeavor to work with the SERVICE AGENCY to find alternative storage space.

VII. SHARED EQUIPMENT:

The CITY and SERVICE AGENCY share equipment whenever it makes sense to do so. Shared equipment is purchased and maintained on a 50-50 basis. The parties will meet annually during **September** to discuss the shared equipment and plan for maintenance and replacement so that both parties can budget the needed funds. A list of shared equipment will be maintained by both the CITY and the SERVICE AGENCY and updated annually.

NATURE OF APPLICATION

The applicant is seeking to annex one 1.65 acre tax lot into the City of Canby (Lot 1800 of Tax Map 3-1E-28DD). If annexed, the applicant intends to build approximately 9 single family homes in addition to one existing single family home. The site is located south of NE Territorial and is part of an island of County land surrounded by property within the City boundary. The property is designated priority A for annexation.

HEARINGS

The Planning Commission held a public hearing and considered this application at its meeting of July 14, 2003. The City Council held a public hearing and considered the same application at its meeting of August 20,2003.

CRITERIA AND STANDARDS

The Planning Commission forms a recommendation that the City Council may consider after conducting a public hearing. If the City Council approves the application, it forwards its recommendation to the voters of Canby as a ballot measure where a final decision is reached during a general election. If the City Council denies the application, that denial becomes the final decision and the application is not placed before the voters.

Section 16.84.040 of the Canby Municipal Code states that when reviewing a proposed annexation, the City Council shall give ample consideration to the following:

- 1. Annexation shall be in keeping with prioritization categories, as designated on the adopted maps showing growth phasing (Urban Growth Element of the Comprehensive Plan).
- 2. Analysis of the "need" for additional property within the city limits shall be provided.
- 3. Smaller non-farm land shall be considered a priority for annexation over larger

farm land;

- 4. Access shall be adequate to the site;
- 5. Adequate public facilities and services shall be available to service the potential (or proposed) development;
- 6. Compliance with other applicable city ordinances or policies;
- 7. Compliance of the application with the applicable sections of Oregon Revised Statutes Chapter 222. (In other words, a triple majority type application must contain proof that a triple majority does, in fact, exist, etc.);
- 8. Risk of natural hazards which might be expected to occur on the subject property shall be identified;
- 9. Urbanization of the subject property shall not have a significant adverse effect on specially designated open space, scenic, historic or natural resource areas;
- 10. Economic impacts which are likely to result from the annexation shall be evaluated in light of the social and physical impacts. The overall impact which is likely to result from the annexation and development shall not have a significant adverse effect on the economic, social and physical environment of the community, as a whole.

FINDINGS AND REASONS

The City Council deliberated on all input presented at the August 20, 2003 meeting. The City Council incorporates the August 9, 2003 Staff Report and Council deliberations as support for its decision. The City Council accepted and adopted the findings in the August 9, 2003 Staff Report.

CONCLUSION

The City Council of the City of Canby concludes that, based on the findings and conclusions contained in the August 9, 2003 staff report, and based on Council deliberations at the August 20, 2003 public hearing:

- 1. The land is designated as Priority "A" for annexation.
- 2. The buildable land supply is estimated between 2 and 3 years within the City.
- 3. The property is currently part of an island of unincorporated land surrounded by land inside the City limits.
- 4. Access to the site is adequate and will be further improved by improvements to the roadway in conjunction with development.
- 5. The City and other service-providing entities are able to amply provide the area of the proposed annexation with urban level services upon future development.
- 6. The annexation proposal is in compliance with other applicable City ordinances or policies.
- 7. The annexation proposal complies with all applicable sections of Oregon Revised Statutes.
- 8. No natural hazards have been identified on the site.
- 9. The effect of urbanization of the subject property to designated open space, scenic, historic or natural resource areas is limited.
- 10. Adverse economic impacts are not likely to result from annexation of the subject parcel.

ORDER

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CANBY APPROVES application ANN 03-04 and sends the application to the Canby voters for a final decision with the following understandings:

- 1. Zoning classification for the property will be R-1.5, Medium Density Residential.
- 2. All service connections, recording costs and future development costs are to be borne by the property owner.
- 3. Advanced financing charges for the properties are to be paid at the time of connection to City Services.
- 4. All City and service provider regulations are to be adhered to at the time of connection of services and/or future development.
- 5. Sidewalks and utility easements are normally conditioned as a part of new development. Sidewalks and utility easements will be required upon any future land use application, including issuance of building permits or application for subdivision and development.
- 6. Any costs associated with the election that are not covered by the initial deposit shall be the responsibility of the applicant/property owner. Costs shall be payable upon receipt of an itemized billing from the City of Canby.
- 7. The Canby Utility Board may choose to use an existing well on the property to service eventual development. The applicant shall consult with the Canby Utility Board, regarding use of the existing well, prior to application for subdivision and development.

NATURE OF APPLICATION

The applicant is seeking to annex one 4.63 acre tax lot into the City of Canby (Lot 400 of Tax Map 3-1E-28C). If annexed, the applicant intends to build approximately 20 single family homes served by a single street off of N Locust Street. The site is located north of NE Territorial Road along the west side of N Locust. The property is designated priority A for annexation.

HEARINGS

The Planning Commission of the City of Canby held a public hearing and considered this application at its meeting of July 28, 2003. The City Council also held a public hearing and considered this application at its meeting of August 20, 2003.

CRITERIA AND STANDARDS

The Planning Commission forms a recommendation that the City Council may consider after conducting a public hearing. If the City Council approves the application, it forwards its recommendation to the voters of Canby as a ballot measure where a final decision is reached during a general election.

Section 16.84.040 of the Canby Municipal Code states that when reviewing a proposed annexation, the Commission shall give ample consideration to the following:

- 1. Annexation shall be in keeping with prioritization categories, as designated on the adopted maps showing growth phasing (Urban Growth Element of the Comprehensive Plan).
- 2. Analysis of the "need" for additional property within the city limits shall be provided.
- 3. Smaller non-farm land shall be considered a priority for annexation over larger farm land;
- 4. Access shall be adequate to the site;
- 5. Adequate public facilities and services shall be available to service the potential (or proposed) development;
- 6. Compliance with other applicable city ordinances or policies;

- 7. Compliance of the application with the applicable sections of Oregon Revised Statutes Chapter 222. (In other words, a triple majority type application must contain proof that a triple majority does, in fact, exist, etc.);
- 8. Risk of natural hazards which might be expected to occur on the subject property shall be identified;
- 9. Urbanization of the subject property shall not have a significant adverse effect on specially designated open space, scenic, historic or natural resource areas;
- 10. Economic impacts which are likely to result from the annexation shall be evaluated in light of the social and physical impacts. The overall impact which is likely to result from the annexation and development shall not have a significant adverse effect on the economic, social and physical environment of the community, as a whole.

FINDINGS AND REASONS

The City Council deliberated on all input presented at the August 20, 2003 meeting. The City Council incorporates the August 8, 2003 Staff Report and Council deliberations as support for its decision. The City Council accepted and adopted the findings in the August 8, 2003 Staff Report in so far as they do not conflict with the following supplemental findings:

- The City Council found that when considering the approved annexations pending before voters, as well as the approved UGB amendment to add 30 acres of residential land (currently pending before the State Land Use Board of Appeals) that the 3-year supply of buildable land that is considered sufficient could be met or exceeded. Therefore, the need for this property to be annexed is not established.
- The City Council found that the impacts of annexation and development of this property are greater than the size of the parcel would suggest. Because the parcel is part of larger, contiguous agricultural land and because the parcel is surrounded on three sides by agricultural land outside the city limits and property on the fourth side inside city limits but still under agricultural production, potential development is anticipated to negatively impact surrounding agricultural use more than other land in the UGB which is directly adjacent to developed property. Therefore, despite the relatively small size of the parcel, it should not be considered a priority for annexation.
- The Planning Commission found that, although the applicant has volunteered to perform off-site improvements to Locust street, there was not sufficient specificity as to the type of improvements were being offered as to ensure adequate access for this or other neighboring properties. Based on supplemental submittal by the applicant, the City Council finds that the applicant has addressed the issue of insufficient access. The applicant's proposal to pave additional width of N Locust Street to City street standards is sufficient to provide access to the site.

The City Council of the City of Canby concludes that, based on the findings and conclusions contained in the August 8, 2003 staff report, and based on Council deliberations at the August 20, 2003 public hearing:

- The land is designated as Priority "A" for annexation.
- The current buildable land supply is estimated at less than 2 years within the City. The foreseeable buildable lands supply from additional proposed annexations is uncertain but may in fact exceed the three year supply considered adequate for the City of Canby should those annexations be approved by the voters.
- 3. Although the property is smaller, it is still part of a larger tract of farm land and almost completely surrounded by other productive farm land.
- Access to the site is not adequate but the level of off-site improvements proposed by the applicant are considered sufficient to provide adequate access to the development. The City Council concludes that there is sufficient evidence to assure that adequate access for this parcel and future neighboring development will be constructed through the execution of development agreement.
- With the exception of transportation access, the City and other service-providing entities are able to amply provide the proposed annexation with urban level services upon future development.
- The annexation proposal is in compliance with other applicable City ordinances or policies.
- The annexation proposal complies with all applicable sections of Oregon Revised Statute.
- No natural hazards have been identified on the site.
- 9. The effect of urbanization of the subject property to designated open space, scenic, historic or natural resource areas is limited, in that the open space designation and requirements as found in the Parks Master Plan will be adhered to.
- 10. Adverse economic impacts are not likely to result from annexation of the subject parcel.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED BY THE CITY COUNCIL that application ANN 03-06 is DENIED.

Attached is Resolution No. 844. It certifies to Clackamas County elections department for the November 4, 2003 election, Annexation 03–04, application from John Meredith to annex 1.65 acres of property into the City. The Planning Commission unanimously approved the application, as did the City Council, and in accordance with the City Charter requirement for voter-approved annexations, the application must be voted on at the next election.

Attached to the Resolution is a Notice of City Measure Election with the Caption, Question and Summary for the ballot and the Explanatory Statement for the Voter's Pamphlet. The City is required to submit these documents when it refers an issue to a vote of the electorate. The deadline for having the material to the County is September 4, 2003.

The guideline for drafting the Notice and Explanatory Statement is that, "the City Attorney, to the best of his ability, give a true and impartial statement of the purpose of the measure in such language that the ballot title not create any argument for, or create prejudice against the measure". I believe the Notice and Statement I have prepared meets this criteria. If you agree, a motion to approve Resolution No. 844 is appropriate. If you are not satisfied with the language, please feel free to contact me before the meeting or draft some alternative language to bring to the meeting so that it can be discussed.

RESOLUTION NO. 844

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY RECORDER TO CERTIFY TO THE CLACKAMAS COUNTY CLERK A MEASURE REFERRING TO THE ELECTORATE A PROPOSED ANNEXATION OF 1.65 ACRES DESCRIBED AS TAX LOT 1800 OF TAX MAP 3-1E-28DD LOCATED IN THE NORTHEAST QUADRANT OF THE CITY, ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF NE TERRITORIAL ROAD AND EAST SIDE OF N OAK STREET; AUTHORIZING THE CITY RECORDER TO SEND AN EXPLANATORY STATEMENT FOR THE VOTER'S PAMPHLET; AND DOING ALL OTHER NECESSARY ACTS TO PLACE THE MATTER BEFORE THE VOTERS OF THE CITY OF CANBY FOR THE NOVEMBER 4, 2003 ELECTION.

WHEREAS, the Canby City Council has heretofore approved an application filed by John Meredith, owner and applicant, to annex Tax Lot 1800 of Tax Map 3-1E-28DD which consists of 1.65 acres into the City of Canby; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of the Canby City Charter, the approval of the proposed annexation must be referred to the electorate of the City of Canby for an election; and

WHEREAS, ORS 250.035 requires a Notice of Measure be prepared by the City and submitted to the Clackamas County Elections Department by September 4, 2003 in order to appear on the ballot for the November 4, 2003 election; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Canby Municipal Code, the Canby City Attorney has prepared a Notice of City Measure Election and Summary for Voter's Pamphlet to be submitted to the Elections Department;

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Canby, as follows:

- 1. The City Recorder of the City of Canby is hereby authorized and directed to certify to the Clackamas County Clerk for submission to the voters at the November 4, 2003 election, the Notice of City Measure. Such Notice of City Measure Election is attached to this Resolution in proper form and adopted by the City.
- 2. The City Recorder of the City of Canby is further authorized and directed to submit a Summary of the Measure to be placed in the voter's pamphlet explaining in clear and concise language the affect of such ballot measure. Such summary is attached to this Resolution in proper form and adopted by the City.

3. The City Recorder, the City Administrator and the City Attorney are hereby authorized to do all other necessary and proper acts to place the ballot measure before the voters at the November 4, 2003 election.

This Resolution shall take effect on September 3, 2003.

SUMMARY: Annexation is the legal process to bring property inside the City limits. John Meredith has filed an application as owner, asking the City to bring 1.65 acres of property into the City limits. The legal description of the property is Tax Lot 1800 of Tax Map 3-1E-28DD. The lot is located on the south side of NE Territorial Road and the east side of N. Oak Street. This application was previously approved by the Planning Commission and the City Council. The property contains one single family residence. Properties to the west and north, across Ne Territorial Road from the site, are inside the City limits. Properties to the south and east are outside the City limits, but within the urban growth boundary. The property is designated priority "A" for annexation. Upon annexation, the property will be zoned R-1.5, Medium Density Residential. Although no development application is pending at this time, the applicant has indicated he wishes to construct 9 additional single family residences on the site. Any further development does require City review and must comply with land use laws.
