

Canby City Council
Special Meeting
June 6, 1977

Present: Mayor Rapp, Councilmen Swayze, Taylor, Giger, Nichols, and Knight

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 P.M. followed by the traditional flag salute.

Mayor Rapp stated the first order of business was to canvas the ballot of the Budget Election held on June 1, 1977. Administrator Wyman then read the Abstract of Votes to the Council stating that there were 429 total votes cast with 192 voting yes and 237 voting no. Councilman Giger moved to accept the Abstract of Votes from the Clackamas County Clerks Office as presented, seconded by Councilman Taylor. The motion was passed unanimously.

Resolution No. 226; A RESOLUTION RESTRICTING THE USES OF WATER STOCKED WITH FISH WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF ANY CANBY CITY PARK; was then read by the City Administrator. A brief discussion followed. Councilman Giger moved to accept Resolution No. 226 and be made part of the laws of Canby, seconded by Councilman Swayze. The motion was passed unanimously.

The meeting was then recessed at 7:44 P.M. by motion to reconvene after the workshop.

The meeting was then reconvened at 9:20 P.M.

Councilman Giger moved to accept the energy curtailment of parking lot light and street lights as presented to the Council by Police Chief Cromwell and Sgt. Jerry Giger, seconded by Councilman Knight. The motion was passed unanimously.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:30 P.M.
