

REGULAR MEETING OF THE CANBY CITY COUNCIL

April 16, 1973

The meeting was called to order by the Mayor at 7:30 p.m., followed by the traditional flag salute.

Roll Call: Present - Mayor Roth, Councilmen Gerber, Giger, Kariker and Tate.

Absent - Councilmen Wagner and Westcott.

Others Present - Attorney Bettis, Acting Supt. Whiteside, Fire Chief Buttolph, Acting Chief of Police Graziano, Utility Board Chairman Newton, Foreman Atwood, Employee Roberts, Secretary Hieb and former Councilman Keil.

ORDINANCE NO. 567 AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO DOG CONTROL; REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 124 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

was read on first reading by Attorney Bettis. A motion was made by Councilman Giger, seconded by Kariker that Ordinance No. 567 be accepted on first reading, posting in accordance with the Canby City Charter and to come up for final reading on May 7. After a period of discussion, a motion was made by Councilman Tate, seconded by Gerber to amend said Ordinance to delete section 9 regarding killing of rabid dogs. Upon call, the vote resulted in two "yes" and two "no" and Mayor Roth voted to delete said section 9. Another motion was made by Councilman Tate, seconded by Gerber and carried unanimously to delete a portion of section 10(E) pertaining to the reimbursement of fees and charges paid by a purchaser of impounded dogs. Then, Councilman Giger made a motion, seconded by Gerber and carried unanimously to amend the waiting period for the impounding limitations on dogs from five to ten days. Then upon call for a vote on the original motion resulting in unanimous acceptance.

ORDINANCE NO. 568 AN ORDINANCE FIXING AND ESTABLISHING FEES FOR SEARCH AND CERTIFICATION SERVICES INCIDENT TO THE CITY LIEN DOCKET.

was read on first reading by Attorney Bettis. A motion was made by Councilman Tate, seconded by Giger and carried unanimously to pass Ordinance No. 568 on first reading, posted in compliance with the City Charter and to come up on final action on May 7.

Councilman Tate read excerpts from a letter received from the Labor Negotiation Council and stated that a meeting date was set for 7:30 p.m. Tuesday evening. After a period of discussion, a motion was made by Councilman Tate, seconded by Gerber and carried unanimously permitting the Labor Negotiation Committee to retain a secretary at the going rate and to be present at Labor Negotiation Meetings.

A motion was made by Councilman Kariker, seconded by Giger and carried unanimously authorizing the firm of Kent & Snow to continue the audit of City records through December 31, 1972, and to defer cost until July 1 or later.

The Council discussed the schedule of Budget Preparation meetings and a motion was made by Councilman Kariker, seconded by Giger and carried unanimously to give public notice of the first official budget meeting at 7:30 p.m. DST on May 1, 1973, and to notify members of the Budget Committee.

Councilman Giger reported that Mass. Mutual had promised to present a brochure of a specific retirement insurance program in the near future. After a period of discussion, a motion was made by Councilman Giger, seconded by Tate and carried unanimously authorizing the City to negotiate with Alexander and Alexander, Inc., to furnish \$10,000 insurance policies per state specifications at the rate of \$1.15 per month for uniform city personnel and with provisions for like coverage for all employees.

Acting Supt. Whiteside reported on a recent Solid Waste Disposal meeting he had attended in Oregon City and said the principal purpose of the meeting was for information and development of interest in the program.

A motion was made by Councilman Giger, seconded by Gerber and carried unanimously by roll call vote approving claims against the City for payment and that warrants be drawn on the treasurer in payment thereof.

The Mayor announced a budget workshop scheduled for 7:30 p.m. Wednesday evening.

The practice of issuing business licences for non-conforming business in residential zones was discussed and the Mayor appointed a committee composed of Earl Oliver, John Whiteside, J. R. Richardson, and Councilman Giger to study and make recommendations for future guidelines.

The Recorder read a letter from Paul F. Helton, indicating his disappointment in not being selected as City administrator, but offering his assistance if needed.

The Council discussed with the Public Works Department the land-scaping project at the Zion Memorial Park which had been authorized by the Council in October, 1971. Foreman Atwood said that there were only minor changes in the program, and that all concerned were happy. The Recorder reported having recently received \$20 in contributions to the project which would be turned over to Mrs. Ed Gribble, Chairman.

Councilman Kariker reported on the activities of the Ordinance Committee which meets weekly to draft ordinances for the Council's consideration. He listed as priorities drafting of ordinances pertaining to annexation and cerfew.


Councilman Kariker reported on a recent meeting with Burroughs Corporation representative regarding rental or purchase of electronic equipment capable of handling the City's requirements for a modified accural bookkeeping system.

Councilman Gerber reported a meeting of the committee to review applications for Chief of Police and would meet again on April 24, to further consider the 18 applications having been received.

Councilman Tate questioned the City's authority to assign street names and numbers outside the city limits. Acting Supt. Whiteside said the City had limited jurisdiction for five miles outside the city limits, but that some information regarding the City's activities was eronious, explaining that the endeavor was to continue city names and numbers in sequence outside the City were acceptable by the county.

Mr. and Mrs. Frank McCurty approached the Council to extend appreciation for the Council's action in updating dog control provisions.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:34 p.m.

Kim Daniels and Mrs. Ed Gribble appeared before the Council in the interest of the Cities' prior approval of a landscaping program at Zion Memorial Park under the direction of the Canby Garden Club. The Council reviewed the plans and advised that the Garden Club proceed with the program without delay.
