SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING - SEPTEMBER 14, 1973

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roth at 6:00 P.M. followed by the traditional flag salute.

Roll Call: Present - Mayor Roth, Councilmen Gerber, Giger, Kariker, Wagner and Westcott

Absent - Councilman Tate

Others present - Attorney Bettis, Jr., Publisher Weston, Lloyd Walkoski

Mayor Roth stated the purpose of the meeting as being to hear the reading of Ordinance 572.

Ordinance #572: AN ORDINANCE PROSCRIBING THE DISSEMINATION OF OBSCENE MATERIAL; DECLARING SUCH ACTS TO BE A PUBLIC NUISANCE; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. Ordinance #572 was presented as read by Attorney Bettis, Jr. It was suggested that the Ordinance be discussed at this meeting but not acted upon. After discussion it was decided to place Ordinance #572 on the agenda for the Regular Council Meeting of 9-17-73.

Mayor Roth reported a phone call he had received from a lady through the Boosters Club advising him that school kids were being organized to clean up the streets of Canby. It was also suggested that businesses be responsible for keeping the sidewalks in front of their place of business free of debris.

Mayor Roth informed the Council that he will be in Chicago for four days, and that the payroll checks will have to be taken care of early Monday morning.

Attorney Bettis informed the Councilmen of progress in the Walter et al vs. City of Canby suit. Discussion between the attorney and Council followed.

The recorder, pro-tem, was asked to write to the Attorney General's office requesting pamphlets on the new Open Meeting Laws and the Open Record Law.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:38 P.M.
