REGULAR MEETING OF Canby City Council - October 2. 1967

The meeting was called to order by the Mayor at 8:00 P.M. Roll Call: Present - Mayor Housen and Councilmen Braman, Dinteman, Dresen, Giger and Tatone. Councilman Stevens arrived at 9:10 P.M. Absent - None.

Others present - Attorney Bettis, Superintendent Cox and Fire Chief Christiansen.

Minutes of the meetings of September 18 and 28 were read and approved. Minutes of the Planning Commission meeting of September 20 were read and noted.

Superintendent Cox read a latter from the State Engineer acknowledging receipt of the Milk Creek water right application and asking that the city keep his office advised of the progress of the exploratory surveys and that further action on the application would be withheld during the survey.

The Council discussed the proposed water distribution plans for Zion Cemetery. Superintendent Cox told the Council that approximately 2400 feet of 4 inch pipe had been salvaged and piled at the cemetery for that purpose. He estimated a cost of \$2,000.00 to make the improvement. The Council discussed the need for the cemetery ordinance to be rewritten and brought up to date. Mayor Housen referred the drafting to Councilman Dresen, Attorney Bettis, Superintendent Cox and the Recorder.

The Council discussed the continued request of Mildred Steinhoff that trees adjacent to her property on N.W. 4th Avenue be removed. A motion was made by Councilman Giger, seconded by Braman and carried unanimously that the trees in the street at the Steinhoff property be pruned, shaped and left for the time being.

Ordinance No. 510, AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF CANBY, was read on final reading by the City Attorney. A motion was made by Councilman Giger, seconded by Dinteman and carried unanimously by roll call vote that Ordinance No. 510 be adopted and become a part of the laws of Canby.

Ordinance No. 492, AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE EXTENSIONS OF SEWER AND WATER MAINS: AND PROVIDING FOR THE REFUNDING OF COSTS, was read on final reading by Attorney Bettis. A motion was made by Councilman Giger, seconded by Dinteman and carried unanimously, by roll call vote, that Ordinance No. 492 be adopted and become a part of the laws of Canby

A motion was made by Councilman Giger, seconded by Stevens and carried unanimously that, due to a power outage caused by excessive wind, the meeting be recessed to reconvene at 8:00 P.M. on Tuesday, October 3rd. The Mayor declared the meeting recessed at 9:40 P.M.
