SPECIAL MEETING OF Canby City Council, October 26, 1964.

The meeting was called to order by the Mayor at 12 noon at the Bus Depot Cafe. Present were: Mayor Stefani and Councilmen Giger, Graham, Harper, Housen, Read and Stevens. Absent - None. Others Present: Sup't Cox, Attorney Bettis and the Recorder.

The proposed sever line to the Joseph Keuser property was discussed, particularily the financial responsibility and the availibility to other properties. The Council agreed that the Keusers should be approached to construct and finance the sewer, in the Grant Street r-o-w, to City specifications, and so specify that other property owners wishing to connect to said sewer later would be obligated to participate in the origional cost.

Sup't Cox reported that Charles T. Parker Co. was in the process of blacktopping So. Elm Street and requested a decision from the Council whether or not to have the Parker Co. blacktop Maple Lane. Upon the Sup't's assurance that the materials used would not exceed the money on deposit, the Council directed that the work be done immediately.

The Sup't pointed out to the Council that the completed curb and sidewalk job on So. Elm Street had exceeded the front footage quotation set forth in the City's agreement with Schaefer and Son, due to aditional work and materials in construction of radii and driveways.

Councilman Harper reported that it hadbeen called to his attention that a steer was being pastured on the Rene Dupont property. The Council advised Harper to determine if such was in violation of existing ordinances and if so, to ask the complaintant to register formal complaint at the City Hall.

The Council agreed that the Dwyer Oil Company would be required to obtain a City business license to deliver fuel oil to a residence in Canby.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:20 p.m.
