SPECIAL MEETING OF Canby City Council, October 8, 1962.

The meeting was called to order by the Mayor at 8:55 p.m. Roll Call: Present - Mayor Oliver and Councilmen Giger, Housen, Onion, Read, and Stefani. Absent - Councilman Graham.

Others Present - Sup't Cox.

Minutes of the regular meeting of October 1 was read and noted.

The Recorder reported that petitions had been received for the nominations of Don T. Evans for City Treasurer and William T. Stevens for Councilman, 2 yr term.

Mayor Oliver announced the principal purpose of the special meeting was to determine the feasibility of beginning the street drainage program immediately so that it might be of some benefit this winter.

It was reported that the County Treasurer had assured the Council that at least \$5000 of the special 5 mill street tax levy could be obtained by November 10th and up to 90% of the full 12,193.00 levy could be expected by December 1st.

Sup't Cox reviewed his previous estimate of the drainage project as follows: Storm sewer main to be layed on N.W. Second Avenue from old mill pond approx. 200 feet beyond Cedar Street to Ivy Street, 2600 feet of 21 inch concrete pipe at a cost of \$2.20 per foot. Catch basins to be installed on N.W. First Avenue and connected to main by 8 inch laterals on each street between Cedar and Ivy, 28 catch basins including those on Second Avenue. Depth of main would vary from $\frac{1}{2}$ to 14 feet. Total estimated cost to City - \$10,135.00.

Craig Landsen, excavation contractor, appeared before the Council and was invited by Mayor Oliver to give his impression of the project plans and estimates. Landsen said he thought the estimates were well in line with his customary charges for this type of construction.

A motion was made by Councilman Onion, seconded by Stefani and carried unanimously that the City proceed with the project under the supervision of Sup't Cox, as soon as possible.

The Sup't reported numereous inquiries regarding the curb and sidewalk construction program. The Council agreed that this was the time to encourage property owners to construct curb adjacent to their property as paving will not be completed in blocks where the curb is not all in place.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:12 p.m.
