

Special meeting Canby City Council
August 22nd, 1960.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Irwin at 7:45 PM for the purpose of interviewing applicants for the position of City Recorder.

Roll call, Present: Mayor Irwin, Councilmen Anderson, V. Giger, Oliver, Osness and Stefani.
Attorney Wade Bettis.
Absent: Councilman Howard Giger.

Four applicants from a total of twenty eight were selected by Council Committee and notified to be present at this meeting for personal appearance and interviews by the Council.

Mr. George Carlson was the first to be introduced at 750 PM and his interview continued until 815 PM.

Mr. J.R. Richardson of Anderson California was then introduced to the council by Mayor Irwin for interview.

At 840 PM Mr. F.F. Smith of Portland was introduced and interviewed.

Mr. Robert Parker of Portland was the fourth applicant to be introduced for interview at 905 PM.

At the close of these interviews and personal appearances of these applicants and without any discussion by the Councilmen as to pros and cons of their impressions as to the merits and ability to fill the position, the Mayor called for a secret ballot to express first and second choice of these applicants for the assignment. The result was decidedly in favor of Mr. Richardson.

Virgil Giger then moved that Mr. J.R. Richardson of Anderson California be appointed City Recorder at a monthly salary of \$400.00. Motion was seconded by Kermit Osness and carried.

The recorder was then instructed to so advise Mr. Richardson and ask him to commence work as soon as possible and also to notify all other applicants of the action of the council.
