Regular Meeting of the Canby City Council, October 17, 1960.

The meeting was called to order at 8:05 P.M. by the Council President.

Present . President Stefani, Councilmen Anderson, H.Giger Roll Call: V. Giger and Oliver. Absent - Councilman Osness. Others Fresent - Supt Cox, Chief Younce and Auditor Derr.

The minutes of the meeting of October 3 were read and approved.

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Frank Stauber, representative of Harrell & Company, mausoleum builders, presented a plan for the construction of a mausoleum at Zion Cometery and applied for an option on a percel of cemetery property 27 x 50 feet. The plan was favored by the Council and further discussion was schilled for the next regular meeting.

Auditor Roger Derr gave a detailed report on the 1959-60 audit and made some recommendations for minor changes in proceedure. Councilman Oliver Paccomend-ed transfering the balance of the Water Sinking Fund to the Constant Fund. No action was taken due to the absence of the City Attorney.

A letter from the Department of Interior was read, announcing a Columbia River Basin development meeting to be held in Portland October 19.

Findings of Fact and Orders of the State Sanitary Authority, resulting from the lower Willamette River pollution hearing of September 22 was read by Supt. Cox. Contained therein are the following orders to the City of Canby. "The City of Canby is hereby directed to abate the pollution of the Lower Willemette River by providing with the following schedule secondary treatwillemette hiver by providing with the following schedule secondary treate ment and effective chlorination, or equivlant, for all domestic and municipal sewage effulents discharged by it into the Willamette river: (a) Completion of final plans and specifications on or before July %, 196%, (b) Completion of fiscal program on or before July 1, 196% (c) Completion of construction on or before July 1, 196% Progress reports to be submitted on each December 15 and June 15 until progect has been completed[#]

has been completed".

Supt. Coxis semi-monthly report included the report of a labratory test of the well water and at the sewage treatment plant, revealing a slight hardness but satisfactory for domestic use.

Price quotations on pipe and fittings for the water mains re-location project along Hiway 99E, Prompted the City council to authorize the purchase of Approximately 3200 feet of 10 guage dipped and wrapped 6 inch pipe from Consolidated Supply Co., along with the necessary fittings and velves,

A motion was made by Councilman H. Giger, seconded by Anderson and unanimously carried authorizing the purchase of a Grane Gas Fired Bollor, with the option of installation by either the City or the Grane Co. at the sewage treatment plang.

Councilman Anderson reported that the rental purchase plan for a back-hoe would total \$8094 on a machine selling for \$6900 cash. The council then agreed to investigate the possibilities of purchasing a repossessed back-hoe for eash.

Plans for Canby's representation at the League of Oregon Cities convention were tabled for the next meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:07 P.M.

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
