

Special Meeting of the
Canby City Council, November 10, 1960.

The meeting was called to order by the Council President at 7 p.m.

Instructions were for the Recorder to notify the successful candidates as required by Chapter IV, Sections 6, 7 & 8 of the Canby City Charter.

A motion was made by Councilman H. Giger, seconded by Osness and carried to appoint Mayor elect Earl Oliver to fill out the unexpired term left vacant by the death of George Irwin. City Attorney Bettis then administered the oath of office to Mayor Oliver.

A motion was made by Councilman V. Giger, seconded by H. Giger and carried to appoint Larry Housen as councilman to fill the unexpired term of Oliver.

Sealed bids for a back-hoe, as advertised in the Daily Journal of Commerce on October 24, were opened and compared. A motion was made by councilman V. Giger, seconded by Anderson and carried unanimously to purchase the back-hoe from Fischer Mill Supply Company in that the bid submitted by them was most advantageous to the city.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:15 p.m.
