

Regular Meeting Canby City Council Feb.1,1960.

Meeting called to order by Mayor George Irwin at 8 PM.

Rollcall, Present: Mayor Irwin,  
Councilmen, Anderson, Eversole, H. Giger, V. Giger, Oliver & Stefani.  
Sup't Ancel Dunn and Attorney Wade Bettis.

Minutes of previous regular meeting read and approved.

Claims against City examined. H. Giger made motion seconded by Eversole that all claims be allowed and warrants drawn in payment thereof.  
Roll call vote on motion: Yeas 6 Nays 0. Carried.

Regular monthly reports given by Fire Chief, Police Chief, Sup't and Recorder and reports placed on file.

Mayor Irwin reported a complaint from a citizen regarding sanitary conditions at the Julia Willbroad residence. Recorder was instructed to report the situation to the County Health Department.

A claim for \$801.75 from the Motorola Company was presented. Anderson moved and H. Giger seconded to allow the claim and warrant be issued in payment.  
Roll call vote: Yeas 6 Nays 0.

After some discussion the Council decided to leave the Christian Church electric charge on the demand rate but to make further investigation.

Mayor Irwin then introduced Mr. Carl E. Green, consulting engineer, who was invited to appear at this meeting to assist the Council in their deliberations regarding the City's water expansion program. He explained procedures and possibilities of the over-all expansion and improvement program as set forth in his firm's engineering survey for the City. This was an informative interview and no action was taken at this meeting by the Council.

Earl Oliver reported that in searching for information in the records it was observed that the minutes for several years past were filed in loose leaf form. Recorder was asked to secure binders for proper filing.

A matter of drainage on Grant Street between First and Second Streets was discussed and referred to Street Committee Chairman, Rex Eversole.

Mayor Irwin read a letter from the State Sanitary Department stating that Kenneth McNamee had successfully passed examination as a sewage plant operator. McNamee was commended by the Mayor and the Council for his attainment in this field of service.

Budget appointments: The Mayor appointed Clyde Monahan to fill the unexpired term of A.S. Markee as a member of the budget committee. This term will expire March 17th, 1961. The Mayor then appointed Recorder Markee to serve as Budget Clerk for the 1960-61 budget.

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Mayor Irwin then introduced the matter of proper organization in the City's office for consideration. Attorney Bottis advised the Council that the Charter authorized appointments of non-elective officers as deemed necessary and proper. H. Giger therefor moved and seconded by Anderson that the Mayor be authorized to appoint Ann Fouts as Assistant Recorder, subject to the directions of the Recorder. Motion carried. The Mayor then appointed Ann Fouts Assistant Recorder as authorized by the Council. Mayor Irwin further commended Mrs. Fouts for her services and ability in her work for the City.

Mr. Al Seidas reported progress on his proposed trailer park and in securing signatures for the advancement of sewer facilities and possible organization of a sewer district in the area of his trailer park.

Referendum petitions containing 174 names as signers were presented to the Council against Ordinance No. 429. The Recorder reported he had checked signatures against the voter registration files at the County Clerk's office and that to the best of his knowledge there were 149 valid signatures. Eversole moved and Oliver seconded acceptance of the petitions and to proceed compliance in accordance with Ordinance No. 380 regarding referendums. Motion carried.

Council members unanimously objected to a statement of Mr. Sam Aramson in a letter to the Editor of the Canby Herald issue of January 28th reading in part, "On April 21st Councilman Beck was advised to go ahead and drill well, no ordinance or resolution was passed by the Council, authorizing this procedure ----". Recorder was instructed to assist in drafting a letter to the Editor denying that the Mayor or Council as a body or individually ever advised Mr. Beck as above stated.
