

Regular meeting Canby City Council April 4th, 1960.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Irwin at 8:10 PM

Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

Matter of residents keeping livestock (namely horses) within the City limits adjacent to other residences was presented by Mr. Wm Heath and Robert Krueger. While this currently not a City problem but a private matter between residents due to the fact there is no restricting or zoning ordinance, nevertheless the Recorder was asked to write the Bureau of Municipal Research at Eugene to obtain information regarding zoning or ordinance protection in such matters.

Mr. Sam Amundson presented a proposal to the City Council for them to consider some action toward the elimination of the County Fair at Canby as such and an eventual diversion of the use of the County Fair property to possibly a residential area. He suggested possibility of such accomplishment over a period of five to ten years. Some discussion by the Council ensued but no action of any kind was taken.

Claims against the City were presented for the month of March. Howard Giger moved seconded by Anderson that these claims be allowed and warrants drawn on the Treasurer in payment of same. Roll call vote: Yeas 5 Nays 0.

Police Court and Cemetery report was given by the Recorder and placed on file. Also the report by the Fire Chief on fires and ambulance service.

The Mayor had invited all City employees to this council meeting for the purpose of discussing the matter of harmony and co-operation in all departments of the City services. The Mayor urged and solicited all employees to work in harmony.
