

Council minutes of May 4th, 1959.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Irwin at 8 pm. Roll call; present - Mayor Irwin, Councilmen Beck, Eversole, H. Giger, V. Giger Pond and Stefani. Also present were Att. Bettis, Supt. Dunn and Recorder Lawrence.

Minutes of previous meeting was read and approved.

Communications, Todd Memorial Chapel offering for sale two lots in old section of Cemetery Highway Dept. regarding placing information booth on highway for Centennial-Neal Thompson relating to additional proposal of sale of his well to the city. Petition of five property owners outside the city limits asking for electrical service.

H. Giger moved that the claims be allowed and checks drawn on the treasury, 2nd by Beck. Roll call- 6 ayes, no nays.

Mr. Voss appeared on behalf of the Junior Chamber of Commerce requesting approval of their Centennial program on June 6th. He was informed to submit their program in writing for the councils consideration.

Recorder read Recorders Court report.

Fire Chief Christiansen read Ambulance and Fire Dept. reports.

H. Giger moved that the city allow \$50.00 to the Fire Dept. to pay half the cost of buying an old house on the Becks property for a fire school. Beck 2nd and motion was carried.

On petition for outside the city limits electricity, Supt Dunn explained the area was in the vicinity of Territorial Road and Amrine Road for approximately 2000 feet of coverage. Recorder was instructed to notify the petitioners that it was not the policy of the city to extend its services outside the city limits.

Recorder again read proposal of Neal Thompson on sale of his well to the city.

H. Oathes and Sam Amunson appeared speaking against such proposal.

After council had thoroughly discussed different aspects of the present proposals, Eversole moved that the council take necessary action to hire a competent engineering firm to make a survey and make their recommendations to the city for a long range program. Stefani 2nd and motion was carried.

Recorder was then instructed to write to the State Board of Health and the League of Oregon Cities for a list of competent engineering firms on city water problems.


Beck moved that council give Canby Telephone Assn. permission to install a new phone booth across street from Postoffice if they properly maintain it. Pond 2nd and motion was carried.

Att. Bettis read 1st reading of Ordinance # 423 (raising minimum water rates).

Beck moved that Ordinance # 423 be accepted on its 1st reading and be posted in three conspicuous place for the required period of time. H. Giger 2nd and motion was carried.

H. Giger moved that the meeting be adjourned, 2nd by Eversole and motion was carried.

Meeting adjourned at 10.02 pm.
