

Regular meeting of July 7, 1958.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Dedman at 8.10 pm. Roll call; Present- Mayor Dedman, Councilmen Anderson, H. Giger, V. Giger & Pond. Absent Beck and Oathes. Also present- Att. Bettis, Supt. Dunn and Recorder Lawrence.

Minutes of the previous meeting was approved as mailed.

Communications; Letter from Wallace Ramey asking for extension of time to hook to sewer. Letter from Civil Defense disallowing claim for gravel. Letter from State Highway Dept. re. uniform signs on highways.

Council inspected list of claims.

H. Giger moved that claims be allowed and warrants be drawn on the treasury. Pond 2nd. Roll call- 4 ayes, no nays.

Mayor Dedman announced that this was the time for hearing remonstrances, if there be any against the proposed Sewer District #4, consisting of 7 sub-districts and as more fully shown in the published notice to the owners of the real property in said district, in which said notice was published in the Canby Herald in issues of June 26th and July 3rd, 1958. Recorder Lawrence announced that the notice as published was also mailed to the property owners as required by Ordinance # 393.

Mr. Earl Oliver then addressed the council on matters of information, but concluded that he was not remonstrating against the proposed improvement, but thought the cost was too high.

Mr. Decker asked several questions, but did not remonstrate.

Mr. Bob Wiegand also addressed the council, but did not remonstrate.

Mayor Dedman called for any more remonstrances and as there were none made, the council resumed its regular business.

Mr. Polzin spoke on the new city park. He is very much interested in boosting park donations, etc for Farm Bureau members. Council stated that it could not take a hand in soliciting funds, and it would have to be worked out by community organizations.

Mr. W. Myers addressed the council of city laying sewer across street at grade school, and stated that he believed that there was a agreement between the school and the city at that time, to bring the sewer across the street.

Dr. Guild also spoke on this subject and asked the city to come across the street with the sewer, as their budget was not set up for this additional expense.

Council decided to act on this at its next regular meeting, and for the Recorder to investigate the minutes for any record of any agreement.

V. Giger moved that the city proceed with Sewer District # 4. Anderson 2nd and motion was carried.

Chairman Pond stated that his committee recommended passage of Ordinance # 416 and that he so moved. H. Giger 2nd. Roll call. 4 ayes, no nays.

Att. Bettis read letter that he had received from Att. Beckett concerning N. Thompson selling water to the city.

Treasurer Johnson read his quarterly report. Pond moved that treasurers report be accepted. H. Giger 2nd and motion was carried.

Anderson stated that he had contacted Bob Torgeson on subject of rats in the city dump, and that Torgeson stated that it was not his responsibility.

Att. Bettis read parts of the contract between the city and Mr. Torgeson, and stated that it was his opinion that Torgeson was responsible.

Recorder was instructed to write to Torgeson and asking him to be present at the next council meeting to discuss this matter.

H. Giger read Fire Dept. reports, as Fire Chief Christiansen is out of town.

Recorder read Cemetery and Recorders Court reports.

Pond moved that the balance of the Park Donation Fund of this city, which amounts to \$30.00 be turned over to the Community Park Fund. H. Giger 2nd and motion was carried.

Public hearing of the 1958-59 Budget was opened.

Sen Amundsen addressed the council and stated that salaries of city employees should be shown in budget. Recorder stated that Mr. Amundsen was correct, as far as the budget was concerned with tax levies, but would be difficult to show in other depts as most of the employees wages were prorated among several depts.

Mr. Amundsen also asked about several other items.

Dr. Guild spoke on more police protection and asked it was possible to get more money in the budget for this.

H. Giger moved that the 1958-59 budget be adopted. Anderson 2nd and motion was carried on roll call vote. 4 ayes, no nays.

H. Giger moved that Raney be given an additional 90 days extension of time to look to the city sewerage system. Anderson 2nd and motion was carried.

Supt. Dunn was authorized to call for bids on the new equipment building.

Discussion of Cemetery Sexton. Pond is to get together with Anderson, H. Giger and V. Giger and draw up hours, duties etc for Sexton, and report back next meeting.

H. Giger moved that meeting be adjourned. V. Giger 2nd and motion was carried.

Meeting adjourned at 10.50 pm.
