

Special meeting on water shortage, July 26th, 1958.

A special meeting was called to order by Mayor Dedman at 1.30 pm. All councilmen present except Beck and Oathes.

Supt Dunn stated that the water level is too low for alternate days of sprinkling, as more water is being used now than was used when no restrictions were on. Recommended that water be purchased from Neal Thompson.

Beck arrived at meeting.

Discussion between council and Neal Thompson on possibility of obtaining his water, rates, pipe, pump, etc.

Oathes arrived at meeting.

V. Giger moved that committee make a proposal for rent of pump with Neal Thompson. Pond 2nd and motion was carried.

Pond moved that committee also look into renting of pipe from Neal Thompson. Anderson 2nd and motion was carried.

Beck moved that city accept Neal Thompsons proposal to use his pipe and pump and connect his well to the city water mains for an emergency water supply. The rental of the equipment to be negotiated by Neal Thompson and committee, and the water to be purchased at .08 cents per 100 cuft. Pond 2nd and motion was carried unanimously. *not less than -*

Mayor Dedman appointed Beck to service on committee with Anderson, V. Giger and Att. Bettis.

The committee is to meet at 9 pm Monday, July 28th with Neal Thompson to talk over final terms. Committee in the meantime to look into cost of renting pipe and pump.

A special council meeting is also to be held immediately after this meeting.

Beck moved that Supt. Dunn be authorized to proceed immediately with the emergency hookup with Neal Thompsons water supply. H. Giger 2nd and motion was carried.

Recorder was instructed to inform the city residents by all possible means that water could be used from 6 to 8 pm Sunday, July 27th.

H. Giger moved that meeting be adjourned. Anderson 2nd and motion was carried.

Meeting adjourned at 3.01 pm.
