

SPECIAL MEETING OF SEPT. 22, 1958.

A special meeting for the purpose of Sewer District # 4 was called to order by Mayor Dedman at 8.10 pm. Roll call; Present Mayor Dedman, Councilmen Anderson Beck, V. Giger, Oathes and Pond.

Att. Bettis read Resolution XIX relating to calling for bids for construction of Sewer District #4. Beck moved that Resolution XIX be adopted as part of our records and that the 2nd Monday of October ( Oct. 13th) be the date for receiving and opening of bids. Anderson 2nd. Roll call; 5 ayes no nays.

Att. Biggs appeared in behalf of some property owners regarding Sewer District # 4. He stated that it was his opinion that the Pioneer Cemetery should be assessed to a depth of 100 feet from the road and that the cost should be born by the city. He also stated that it was his belief that the city should bear the cost of laying sewers across street intersections.

After considerable discussion between Mr. Bettis, Mr. Biggs and the council, V. Giger moved that the council rescind action of adoption of Resolution XIX. Anderson 2nd. After discussion on the question, V. Giger and Anderson withdrew their motion.

It was then decided that Att. Bettis should make a careful study into the legal aspects of the points in question and report back at the next regular meeting, before the council would take any further action.

Pond moved that the meeting be adjourned, 2nd by V. Giger and motion was carried.

Meeting adjourned at 10 pm.
