

REGULAR MEETING OF DECEMBER 15th, 1958.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Dedman at 8.05 pm. roll call- all councilmen present, also present were Att. Bottis, Supt. Dunn and Rec. Lawrence.

Minutes of previous meeting were read and approved.

Report of Committee on crop damage claim of Neal Thompson was read,

Beck moved that committee report on Neal Thompson damage claim be made part of the minutes of this meeting. Cathas 2nd and motion was carried.

Anderson moved that Neal Thompsons claim of \$100.00 for crop damage during period that city used his well be paid in compromise settlement of a disputed claim and that it be so indicated on the draft. Pond 2nd and motion was carried.

Cathas moved that all members of the 1958 receiving election board be paid the sum of \$2.00 each. H. Giger 2nd and motion was carried.

Communications: Supt Dunn report of sewer hook ups- Blitz Weinhard Co. on sign- beer license applications of Cutsforths Market and Canby's Big Store.

Recorder was instructed to make Supt. Dunns report on properties that cannot hook up to sewer and those who can hook up but at a great expense, a part of the minutes of the meeting.

Beck moved that John Vigus be notified that it is the opinion of the City Supt. that his facilities are too low to be served by the present sanitary system, and that his Sewer Service charges is being discontinued and all preceeding Sewer Service charges will be refunded. H. Giger 2nd and motion was carried.

Beck moved that action to compel the following named property owners- Mrs Frank Cutsforth, 255 NW 2nd, Glen Cutsforth 752 Ferry Rd, Dr. V. Chronovsky 834 N Ivy, Ben Stoner 339 Knights Bridge Rd and SR Smith & Co Hwy 99E to hook to the public sewer is postponed for a indefinite period of time. Anderson 2nd and motion was carried.

Att. Bottis read 2nd and final reading of Ordinance # 420.

H. Giger moved that Ordinance # 420 be accepted on its final reading and be part of the records. Anderson 2nd and motion was carried, by roll call vote- 6 ayes, no nays.

Att. Bottis read Ordinance # 421 on its 1st reading( Light Dept Reserve Funds)

Beck moved that Ordinance # 421 be accepted on its 1st reading as amended and be posted in three conspicuous places for the required period of time. H. Giger 2nd and motion was carried.

H. Giger moved that beer licenses for Cutsforth Market and Canby's Big Store be granted subject to approval of the Oregon Liquor Commission. Beck 2nd and motion was carried.


H. Giger stated that the Fire Hall walls are in bad shape due to leakage and asked if Supt. Dunn be instructed to get someone to inspect it.  
Supt. Dunn was so instructed.

Chairman Beck of the Wage Committee read a report of his committee to leave all wages as they are, with the exception that Ann Fouts wages be raised from \$ 300.00 to \$325.00 and Marie Gansomer wages be raised from \$275.00 to \$300.00 monthly, as of January 1st, 1959.

Pond moved that committees report be accepted. V. Giger 2nd and motion was carried.

Pond moved that meeting be adjourned. 2nd by Anderson and motion was carried.

Meeting adjourned at 10.30 pm.

A committee of Councilmen Anderson, H. Giger and Oathes met with Neal Thompson at his farm on Saturday, Nov. 22nd to discuss the crop damage that Neal Thompson claimed was done during the period that the city was using his well.

The alleged damage was <sup>claimed</sup> ~~found~~ to be as follows;

Barley field damage; A area of approximately 12 feet wide and 500 feet long.  
Clover field damage; A area of approximately 12 feet wide and 1300 feet long,  
Approximately 3/4 ton of straw on road crossing.  
A swath thru his grain field that he had cut prior to laying of actual pipe, which was not used, that Thompson harvested.  
A few small corners that the committee felt was too small to consider.

The committee asked Thompson to submit a claim for this damage, but Thompson stated that he would leave it up to the city.

The committee felt at this time that the problem should be brought to the attention of the council for any further action.
