

Regular Meeting
Monday, June 3-1957

The Council met in regular session on Monday, June 3 and was called to order at 8.05 o'clock, P.M.

Present: Mayor Dedman, Atty. Bettis, Supt. Dunn, Fire Chief Christiansen, the Recorder and Councilmen Beck, H. Giger, V. Giger, Oathes and Pond. Absent-Anderson.

The minutes of the previous meetings of May 20 and 31 were read and approved.

Communications

Letter from Cornell, Howland, Hayes and Merryfield relative to the claim of R.O.Andrus for damage settlement in connection with sewer installment. (letter in files.)

Reports

Fire Chief Christiansen reported as follows: No fire calls.

Police Chief Younce reported car mileage in May 888 miles-gas used 189 gals. also various and usual other activities.

The Recorder reported 5 cases in Court resulting in fines assessed of \$ 67.50-costs \$ 16.75-net \$ 50.75

Clayton Yoder for the Cemetery reported receipts of \$ 555.00 for May.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by H. Giger and carried, that in the matter of R.O.Andrus claim for damages, the fish pond and four trees be replaced rather than a cash payment.

It was then moved by V. Giger, seconded by Oathes and carried, that extra help be employed in the office at 1.50 per hour to assist in preparing sewer assessment figures, the matter being left to Atty Bettis who agreed to furnish the help and electric typewriter.

It was then moved by Oathes, seconded by Beck and carried, that the deed to the City, signed and delivered by James F. Hudson and wife and Albin Erickson and wife, for street purposes, known as South Holly, now be placed of record.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Pond and carried, that the plan for the extension of S.W. 2nd. Avenue, submitted by John Rasmussen be returned to the Planning commission and that the bill of Eng. Tatone in connection therewith, be sent back to Rasmussen, advising him that the Council does not deem it a liability of the City.

The matter of improving and enlarging the Quonset Hut was then presented and after discussion, the Mayor appointed Councilmen Pond, Oathes and H. Giger and Supt. Dunn to confer with builders and/or architects, in order to arrive at the best plan for the proposed improvements.

Matter of sewer service for the Ed. Krueger building on So. Grant St.

It was moved by H. Giger, seconded by Beck and carried, that an easement for sewer connection be granted Krueger, providing he assume one-half the cost of line from 2nd. Avenue to his property line, plus his own connection cost.

It was also moved by Oathes, seconded by Beck and carried, that the bid of Ralph Kinsley (\$419.71) for sewer connections for the Fire Hall and Krueger property be accepted.
