

Regular Meeting  
Monday, January 7 - 1957

The Council met in regular session on Monday, Jan. 7 and was called to order at 8 O'clock P.M.

Present: Mayor Dedman, Atty. Bettis, Supt. Dunn, Fire Chief Christiansen, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Howard Giger, Virgil Giger, Oathes and Pond.

The Recorder announced that the newly elected and re-elected officials and councilmen had previously taken their oaths of office.

The minutes of the previous meeting of December 17 were then read and approved.

Communications.

From the Secretary of the Canby Volunteer Fire Department, to the effect that at its regular annual meeting, the Department had unanimously chosen Norman Christiansen as Fire Chief for the ensuing year and recommended his appointment by the Council.

From Mrs. Flavilla Skinner, 431 S.W. 5th. Avenue, stating that there seemed to be insufficient electric power serving her dwelling and immediate neighborhood and asked for investigation.

Letter from Jack, Goodman and Santos, Oregon City attorneys, presenting claim of P.E. Stolze against the City for damages resulting in sewer operations. \$ 350.

Also from Theodore Opsund, Atty., presenting claim of Bill Lam for \$ 750., damages caused by same operations.

Both of above claims were handed to Atty. Bettis for his consideration.

An application for the position of apprentice lineman by Lawrence Graham was then read by the Recorder, but no action taken.

Reports

City Treasurer Johnson read his report covering the last quarter of the previous year and on motion, seconded and carried, was accepted subject to audit by the Finance Committee.

Fire Chief Christiansen reported two City fire calls in December with minor damages. Also two Rural District fires, the Bonie Hatchery fire resulting in a loss of Approximate \$ 10000.

Also reported 11 calls for the ambulance. Bank balance \$ 1895.54.

An annual report was also submitted, showing 18 city fire calls and 38 in the rural district, together with other details. ( see files).

Police Chief Younce reported mileage covered by police car during the month-863 miles, gas used 177 gals, 11 arrests and other details.

The Recorder reported 3 court cases with fines of \$ 20.50, costs \$ 4.75.

Cemetery Supt. Yoder's report showed sale of lots-receipts amounting to \$ \$580.00 and charges for grave openings \$ 190.00.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by H. Giger, that Norman Christiansen be appointed fire chief for the current year, in accordance with the wishes of the Volunteer Fire Dept. members. Carried.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Pond and carried, that Atty. Bettis be instructed to contact the State Ind. Accident Commission as to their rules and regulations as to the status of apprentice linemen.

The Council then proceeded to ballot on the election of a President of the Council for the present term and nominations were called for.

Councilmen Beck and Anderson were nominated and the results of the written ballots then cast showed 2 for Beck and 4 for Anderson.

Whereupon the Mayor announced that Councilman Anderson had been chosen to act as President of the Council to serve in the absense of the Mayor.

Ordinance No. 397

The above ordinance coming up for final action, it was moved by Beck, and seconded by Oathes that, having been read by Atty Bettis for the second time, it be placed on its final passage and declared adopted.

On roll call-Yeas 6, Nays 0 and so ordered.

Mayor Dedman then announced that she would at this time make the following Committee assignments :

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Oathes and carried, that the Blaessing Granite Co. be requested to have a representative of its company at the next meeting of the Council, for the purpose of ironing out certain misunderstandings that seem to prevail in connection with its contract with the City owned Zion Cemetery.

It was then moved by Oathes, seconded by H. Giger and carried, that Gordon Andrus and wife be refunded the sum of \$ 50.00 in connection with sewer assessment No. 61 ; there having been but two connections instead of three, as charged.

It was then moved by H. Giger, seconded by Beck and carried, that the sewer assessment No. 296, Lucille Ayers remain as is, the same having been figured as in other corner lots.
