

Regular Meeting
Mo: y, Febr. 4-1957

The Council met in regular session on Monday, February 4 and was called to order at 8.10 P.M.

Present: Mayor Dedman, Atty. Bettis, Supt. Dunn, Fire Chief Christiansen, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Howard Giger, Virgil Giger, Oathes and Pond.

The minutes of the previous meeting of January 21 were read and approved.

Communications

Letter from Ernie Graham, to the effect that he had been misinformed as to the depth required for his sewer connection, and had therefore been put to considerable additional expense, for which he thought he should be re-embursed, namely in the sum of \$ 54.00. (Dunn to investigate)

Letter from Cornell, Howland, Hayes and Merryfield , recommending an additional allowance to the sewer contractors on their contract, on account of the increased cost of sewer pipe. In this connection, it was moved by Oathes, seconded by Beck and carried, that no action be taken on the recommendation until Supt. Dunn investigate the matter.

Reports

Fire Chief Christiansen reported one City and two rural district fires in January, with minor damages. Also 15 calls for the ambulance between Dec.21 and Jan. 10-57 and financial statement as follows:

Chief of Police Younce reported car mileage 980 and gas consumed 184 gals, also six arrests, various warnings, assistance given, investigations, etc.

The Recorder reported 5 Court cases, fines assessed \$ 45.00-costs \$ 11.25.

Supt. Yoder reported Cemetery receipts for the month of \$ 145.00 .

Fire Chief Christiansen then stated that there was a possibility of purchasing fire equipment thro' the Civil Defense Agency at greatly reduced prices.

Whereupon, it was moved by H. Giger, seconded by Oathes, that the Fire Chief prepare specifications as to purchasing needed equipment in this manner. Carried.

It then appearing that it might be a good idea for the Chief to have help in this, Mayor Dedman stated she would appoint a committee composed of Councilmen Anderson, Beck and Howard Giger for that purpose.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Oathes and carried, that Chairman Pond of the Cemetery committee be authorized to order from the Parker Pub. Co., the revised edition of " Jackson's Law of Burial and Burial Places".(ten days trial) .

Supt. Dunn then reported orally on various matters pertaining to the treatment plant, causes of recent electric power outgages and the need of greater power supply.

Whereupon it was moved by Virgil Giger, seconded by Beck and carried, that Supt. Dunn be instructed to prepare plans for reconstructing the system to carry voltage of 12500 ; work to commence and be done through the summer months.

It was then moved, seconded and carried, that another assistant be employed in the office, when needed; also that two more chairs be installed.

It was then reported by Mr. Dunn, that the Planning Commission had recommended that the request of the American Legion to be allowed to remove certain trees on Holly street be granted , with no objections from the Council, it was understood that the Post be so notified.

It was then moved by Oathes, seconded by Beck and carried, that the engineering firm employed by the City in connection with the sewer installation be advised as follows: " We are not receiving sufficient (daily) reports on sewer operations and we feel that we are not properly being served for the best interest of the people, and that we are entitled to have a member of your firm at least once a month at council meetings." (Atty Bettis attending to this).

Councilman Pond then reporting on Cemetery matters stated that, in his opinion, it would be advisable to terminate the contract with the Blaessing Granite Co. and allow other business firms to compete and sell stones and markers; also that it be understood that the Supt. should not personally compete or recommend.

Whereupon it was moved by Pond, seconded by Beck and carried, that the Blaessing Granite Co. be notified legally and in accordance with the terms of the existing contract, that same would be discontinued.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Pond and carried, that the street commissioner be authorized to establish "loading zones " and "no parking" zones where needed .

Ordinance No. 399

The above Ordinance, authorizing the issue of Bancroft bonds in the sum of \$ 51432.05 was then introduced, read for the first time, and on motion by Beck, seconded by H. Giger and carried, declared passed on its first reading, ordered posted in the prescribed legal manner, and to come up for final action at a special meeting of the Council to be held on Wednesday, Febr. 20, 1957.
