

Regular Meeting  
Monday, March 4-1957

The Council met in regular session on Monday, March 4 and was called to order at 8.10 o'clock P.M.

Present: Mayor Dedman, Atty Bettis, Supt. Dunn, Fire Chief Christiansen, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Howard Giger, Virgil Giger and Pond.

The minutes of the meetings held on February 18th and 20th were read and approved.

The Mayor announced that before proceeding to regular business, any visitors, so desiring, might address the Council.

Whereupon, Mrs. Nettie Utley of 552 N.W. 2nd. Avenue, stated that while her modest dwelling consisted of another small apartment, other than her own, she did not think she should be charged a sewer commercial rate.

After due consideration, it was moved by Pond, seconded by Beck and carried, that the dwelling house rate be allowed in this case.

Whereupon Engineers Rhoderick, Bales and Goyette being present, the Council proceeded to take up various sewer matters pending.

The claim of Ernie Graham of \$ 54.00, mentioned in the minutes of Febr. 4 and in connection with his sewer hook-up, was bro't up and Mr. Rhoderick agreed to investigate and report the results.

The matter of the request of the sewer contractors for an increased allowance, on account of wage raises since original contract was signed, was also discussed and explained by Rhoderick. (no action) .

Mr. Bales told the Council, that before sewer matters involving the Southern Pacific could be adjusted, it would be necessary to have a conference and find out just what they wanted.

Fire Chief Christiansen then submitted the following reports:

One City and three rural calls in February-no amount of damages reported.

Ambulance was called out 18 times between the dates of Jan. 17 and Febr. 18, inc.

Christiansen also stated that the members of the Volunteer Fire Dept. had gone on record as being unfavorable to the idea of allowing the Fire Hall to be used for meetings, etc. by others than their own department.

He also reported that application had been forwarded to the Civil Defense Agency for equipment and supplies under the divided expense plan, whereby the Federal Agency would assume one-half, the State one quarter and the City and Rural Fire District the balance.

It was then moved by Howard Giger, seconded by Beck and carried, that the City assume and pay one eighth of the expense of the Vocational Education School for firemen.

Councilman Beck, Chairman of the Finance Committee, then recommended that the sum of \$ 2000, as set up in the Budget for a building fund, be taken from that fund and placed in the Light Fund, on account of the increased expenses incidental to greater electric power installation now in progress.

Whereupon, on motion by Beck, seconded by H.Giger and carried, the above recommendation was approved and it was so ordered.

Councilman Beck then presented the matter of charges for water connections, it appearing that the City was losing too much under the present charges.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Anderson and carried, that Atty Bettis be instructed to prepare an ordinance, amending Ordinance No. 347 to the effect that the City will install meters and connections at actual cost and assume \$ 30.00 of the amount thereof, the customer to be charged for the balance.

Ordinance No. 400

This ordinance amending Ord. No. 399 a/c Bancroft bond issue, changing the amount to \$ 48935.30 and date of sale to April 8, 1957 was introduced and read by Atty. Bettis, and on motion, seconded and carried, declared passed on its first reading and to come up for final action at a special meeting of the Council to be held on Wed., March 20, 1957.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Pond and carried, that the Recorder be instructed to advise the Catholic, Methodist and Assembly of God churches, that their sewer assessments cannot be included in the Bancroft bond plan.
