

Special Meeting
Monday, March 25-1957

A special meeting of the Council was held on Monday, March 26 and called to order at 8.10 o'clock, P.M.

Present: Mayor Dedman, Supt. Dunn, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Virgil Giger, Oathes and Pond. Absent Howard Giger.

Mayor Dedman announced that the meeting had been called at the request of Councilman Beck and would ask him to start the proceedings.

Councilman Beck then stated that he had asked for the meeting for the purpose of discussing the traffic problem mostly on South Ivy street during the sewer operations. After a lengthy discussion, it was decided that it would be advisable to detour traffic for a while and when necessary in the opinion of the engineers.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Anderson and carried, that the City of Canby will release the State from the responsibility of traffic damage to our portion of Radcliff Road and So. Elm St., providing the contracting firm of A.L. & A. will pay for the traffic control system to be set up by the State.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Pond and carried, that the State Highway Dept's directions and requirements as to cutting across So. Ivy street, for sewer purposes, be accepted, signed and returned as requested.

Council Pond then reported that in company with the City Engineer, he had visited the property on the Molalla River, acquired from the County and found it to have possibilities, although access to the location would require some figuring and it would probably be necessary to secure easements and rights of way.

It was then moved by Oathes, seconded and carried, that the Lion's Club be allowed to remove turf in Wait Park and prepare the ground for a suitable baseball diamond.

The Council also granted permission for use of the Park on the afternoons of April 26 and May 10 by the girls' soft ball games.

It then appearing that Atty. Bettis had received a proposal regarding a new location for disposal of the City's garbage and refuse, it was moved, seconded and carried, that the plan be accepted, if upon investigation, a suitable agreement could be reached.

Mayor Dedman then stated that she had received an invitation to attend a series of meetings covering the subject of Municipal Government planning and development etc.; meetings to be held at Vancouver on Wednesday evenings; Suggested that members of the Council might also wish to attend.

The Mayor also mentioned having an invitation to attend the Oregon City celebration to be held on May 14.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
