## MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF CANBY CITY COUNCIL CANBY, CLACKAMAS COUNTY, OREGON APRIL 8th, 1957

A special meeting of the Canby City Council was duly held in the City Hall at Canby, Oregon, commencing at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P. M., Standard Oregon Time, on the 8th day of April, 1957, pursuant to Section 7 of City Ordinance No. 400, which was passed by the City Council on the 2nd and final reading on March 20th, 1957. The meeting was for the particular purpose of opening and considering bids for the purchase of the City's Improvement Bonds, Series I, to be issued pursuant to the Bancroft Act and as more particularly provided by Ordinance No. 400. At said meeting the following Councilmen and officers were present, to-wit:

Mayor Bertha E. Dedman, City Recorder H. B. Evans, Attorney for the City, Wade P. Bettis, City Superintendent, Ancel Dunn and City Councilmen, Elmer Anderson, John Pond, Howard Giger and Virgil Giger.

Councilmen John Beck and Harold Oathes were absent.

The Council Meeting was called to order by Mayor Bertha E. Dedman and the reading of the previous minutes were dispensed with on motion duly carried. Whereupon the Council proceeded to open the sealed bids received by the City Recorder pursuant to the advertisement of the proposed sale of Bancroft Bonds of the City.

The following bids for said bonds were received:

Upon due consideration and after a short discussion by each Councilman present, the Council determined that after taking into consideration the cost to the City the highest and best bid received for the bonds was that of Foster & Marshall, Portland, Oregon. Accordingly, upon motion duly made, seconded and adopted, the said bid was accepted. Thereupon Councilman Pond offered and moved the adoption of the following transcribed Resolution, which motion was duly seconded and unanimously adopted, to-wit:

### **RESOLUTION**

BE IT RESOLVED that the \$48,935.30 in City of Canby Improvement Bonds, Series I, sold on this 8th day of April, 1957, be issued to bear date the 1st day of May, 1957; to bear interest at the rate of  $3\frac{1}{2}\%$  per annum for the bonds of the issue maturing on May 1st, 1958, through 1961, and at a rate of 33/4% per annum for the bonds of the issue maturing on May 1st of the years 1962 through 1967, inclusive; that the bonds be issued to mature serially on the date provided in City Ordinance No. 400, adopted by the City Council on final reading on the 20th day of March, 1957, and that the bonds be prepared forthwith and delivered upon their approval as to validity by Messrs. Winfree, McCulloch, Shuler & Sayre to Foster & Marshall at their Portland address.

# Regular Meeting - Monday, April-1-1957

A regular meeting of the Council was held on Monday, April \$ and called to order at 8,10 o'clock P.M.

Present: Mayor Dedman, Atty, Bettis, Supt. Dunn, Fire Chief Christiansen, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Howard Giger, Virgil Giger, Oathesand Pond. The minutes of previous meetings of March 18-20th.-25th. and 27th. were read

and approved, subject to correction in the March 18 minutes. (since been made.)

#### Communications

From the Secretary of the City Planning Commission recommending to the Council various matters pertaining to city affairs. (see file).

From the Canby Garden Club withdrawing their request for permission to use the Fire Hall for a meeting to be held on April 25.

From the League of Oregon Cities announcing that it would be necessary to raise its annual dues.

From Cornell, Howland, Hayes and Merryfield relative to the Graham service connection on No. Ivy and stating, that in their opinion, the cost should be equally divided between the City and A. L. & A. Contractors. ( This matter to be held up for later action)

From R.W. Freece, Secy-Treas. of the Canby Civil Defense Police Reserves, asking for permission to use the Fire Hall for school classes in May and November. In this connection, it was moved, seconded and carried that the request be granted.

#### Reports

The City Treasurer presented and read his report for the quarter ending March 31st., the same being accepted subject to audit by the finance committee.

Police Chief Younce reported mileage on car for March-789 miles, gasoline consumption 206 gals, various activities, etc.

The Recorder reported 6 cases in Court-Fines \$ 73.00-Costs \$ 18.25

Engineer Chas. Bales reported having contacted the Highway Dept. regarding crossing 99E, the permit stating that it must be done by boring.

Therefore Bales thought an attempt should be made to bore and if found too difficult, get permission to do otherwise.

In the matter of sewer connections for the So. Pacific, he stated that nothing had as yet been done as to their requirements.

### Civil Defense

Bruce Burns, Civil Defense director for Canby, reported that he was getting units organized and familiarizing himself as to his duties.

### Resolution X1

This resolution appointing Councilman Anderson and Fire Chief Christiansen to act in the purchase of government surplus property or equipment, was then introduced and on motion of H. Giger, seconded by Beck and carried, declared adopted. On roll call-Yeas 6, Nays Ø .

### Resolution X11

This Resolution establishing the " CANBY CIVIL BEFENSE AGENCY" and appointing Bruce Burns, Director thereof, was also introduced and on motion of Oathes, seconded by H. Giger and carried, declared adopted .

On roll call, Yeas 6-Nays 0 .

Supt. Yoder for the Cemetery then toldthe Council he would like to see certain improvements made, such as extending the water system, and improving some ground, where it would, justifiable to charge more for lots He also asked permission to buy some Evergreen trees and on motion by

Anderson, seconded by V. Giger and carried, this was granted.

### April 1-continued

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Oathes and carried, that the Erickson-Hudson deed (unrecorded) granting what would be So. Holly st., be referred to Atty. Bettis for his opinion, after he consults with the engineer as to conditions of the street and matters involved, if any; if found satisfactory, said deed to be returned to the Recorder for filing.

Then ensued a discussion with Bob Torgeson regarding a new garbage contract, this matter being left to committee for investigation and recommendation.

It was then moved by Oathes, seconded by Beck and carried, that Kenneth McNamee be allowed a weeks vacation with pay in advance; also that James Pettit wage be raised to \$ 2.35 per hour and that of James Watkins to \$ 2.85 per hour, both to take effect from April 1-1957.

It was then moved by Oathes, seconded by Pond and carried, that Ron Tatone be employed to work with the city engineer in surveying the road through the B.J.Berg property leading to the city recreation park on the Molalla River.

It was then moved by Pond, seconded by Oathes and carried, that the agreement with Berg, drawn by Atty Bettis in relation to the above, be approved. Roll Call -Yeas 6-Nays0.

#### Ordinance No. 402

This Ordinance relating to water connections and installation costs was introduced, read for the first time and on motion by Beck, seconded by Howard Giger and carried ,declared passed on first reading, ordered posted in the prescribed legal manner, and to come up for final action at a regular meeting of the City Council to be held on Monday, May 6, 1957.
