P rular Meeting Tuel Ly, Sept. 4-1956

The first regular meeting in September was held on Tuesday, the 4th., the first Monday falling on a holiday.

The meeting was called to order at 8.15 P.M., with the following present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Bettis, City Engineer Tatone, Fire Chief Christiansen, the Recorder & Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Hulbert and Kraft; Councilman Oathes reporting later.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of August 20 and those of the special of August 29 were read and approved.

Communications

From Mrs. Flavilla A. Skinner, protesting against being required to connect to the sewer at this time.

Protest signed by twenty or more property owners in Sewer District No. 2 against being assessed more per lineal foot than those in District No. 1.

From the State Highway Commission regarding traffic signal lights and not recommending any change at the Ivy street intersection at the present time) until such time as more information is received regarding the effectiveness of over-sized traffic signal lenses.

Sewer Petitions

The following petitions for a Sanitary Sewer were then presented:

Block 7- 0.T.S.-- Block 3, Roth's Addition --- Between NE 1st Ave. and NE 2nd. Ave. to serve area from trunk line on L. Beck property to east boundary of Auto Wreckers.

On motion by Hulbert, seconded by Anderson and carried, the above petitions were declared accepted and the Engineer directed to make survey and a written report of sewer project as petitioned and submit by the first meeting in Nov.

Mayor Eversole then announced publicly that, "This is the time and place for hearing objections, if any, to the City Engineer's report and plan for a sewer project addition, known as Canby Sewer District No. 2, and the same as approved by the Council at its regular meeting August 20, 1956".

The Recorder announced that he had not received any written remonstrances except the letter from Mrs. Flavilla Skinner, who objected to being forced to hook up to the sewer, after its construction.

Several persons present asked questions relative to the plans as approved by the Council and there was evidence of considerable misunderstanding.

After a general discussion and questions and answers, it was apparent that those present were not remonstrating but seeking information.

It was then moved by Anderson, seconded by Kraft and carried, that the engineer proceed with sewer construction in District No. 2, since there was not sufficient remonstrance.

Mrs. Gladys Young of 367 N. Locust st., being present, complained to the Council that much water accumulated on her property, after heavy rains and asked for something to be done about it. Left to Hulbert and Tatone.

Ordinance No. 394

This Ordinance coming up for final action, on motion by Beck, seconded by Kraft and carried, declared adopted. On Roll call-Yeas 5, Nays 0.

Mayor Eversole then called for nominations to fill the vacancy on the Council, caused by the resignation of Larry Hill.

The name of John B. Pond was presented and there being no other nominations, on motion of Hulbert, seconded by Beck and carried, Mr. Pond was unanimously appointed as a member of the Canby City Council to serve until January 1-1957, unless sooner disqualified.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Oathes and carried, that the sewer contractors be allowed § 1.20 more on Transite pipe where used on sewer extensions. f_{int} fact corrige T

It was moved by Oathes, seconded by Hulbert and carried, that an unused pipe tapping machine owned by the City, be sold to W,B,Tull for § 10.00.

It was then moved by Oathes, seconded by Kraft and carried, that John Steffenson of #485 No. Douglas be connected up with the direct water service line, in lieu of his present service.

It was moved by Kraft, seconded by Beck and carried, that Loyd Younce be allowed .loc a mile for use of his car while the police car was undergoing repairs.
