

Regular Meeting  
Monday, October 1-1956

The Council met in regular session on Monday, Octo. 1 and was called to order at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, City Engineer Tatone, Fire Chief Christiansen, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Hulbert, Oathes and Pond.

The minutes of the meeting on September 17 were read and approved.

Communications

Letter from the City Attorney enclosing copy of the agreement between the City and the So. Pacific Co. relative to installation of flashing light signals at Elm and Ivy sts., and stating that the R.R. plans to install same in the near future.

Also copy of City Attorney's letter to P.E. Asmunstad relative to the City's charge for work in making street improvements in his sub-division and which Mr. Asmunstad considered excessive.

Communication from Ed. L. Johnson, stating that he was not a candidate for any public office and that his name was not to be entered on the ballot for the coming November election.

Reports

City Treasurer Johnson submitted and read his report for the quarter ending Sept. 30 and on motion by Beck, seconded by Oathes and carried, was accepted subject to approval of the Finance Committee.

Fire Chief Christiansen reported no city fire calls in Sept. and two calls in the rural fire district and no damage mentioned.

The ambulance report showed 11 calls between the dates of August 26 and Sept. 17 and financial statement as follows:

Police Chief Younce reported for Sept. mileage on police car 1180 and gas consumed 197 gals; also traffic citations, warnings, investigations, etc. with no unusual activities.

The Recorder reported five court cases, resulting in fines of \$ 36.00, costs \$8.75.

Cleo D. Little residing at 450 N.W. 6th. Avenue then exhibited to the Council a bill of \$ 61.07 submitted to him by the Polzin Radio shop, covering repairs to his T/V set over a period of time and stating that the apparent cause to be excessive voltage.

In this connection, on motion by Hulbert, seconded by Oathes and carried, the City Engineer and Chairman of the light committee were asked to investigate the matter, as well as to the liability of the City, if any.

W. J. Wesenberg of 412 N.W. 3rd. Avenue then addressed the Council, stating that he much regretted having the sewer digging thro' his property on account of his bulb planting, but would not refuse to give an easement. Was told that it seemed to be the only logical route to take and that there would be plenty of time in which to remove bulbs, before sewer work would be necessary.

Roger Derr, Public Accountant, then submitted and read his report, covering audit of the City's books and accounts for the year ending June 30, 1956.

Whereupon on motion by Beck, seconded by Hulbert and carried, the Council voted its approval.

It was then moved by Hulbert, seconded by Beck and carried, that Mrs. Earl Oliver be employed at \$ 1.10 per hour, to serve in the office during Mrs. Decker's vacation period.

Councilman Pond then reported that his committee had considered the liability insurance bids on the police car and accepted the policy of the Haworth Agency.

It then appearing that it would be necessary to re-set the water meter serving the Diving Board plant on 99E, it was moved by Beck seconded by Oathes and carried, that the expense of same should be borne by the property owners.

The Recorder then read a letter from the City Planning Commission, in which the Council was asked to approve an expenditure of \$ 100 to cover preliminary cost of plans and specifications for public rest rooms in Wait Park.

After due consideration it was decided that it would be a good idea for the Council to meet in a body with the Planning Board at its next regular meeting.

It was therefore moved by Beck, seconded by Hulbert and carried, that the Recorder be instructed to advise the Commission by letter, that as many members of the City Council as possible will meet with them at their next regular meeting, on Tuesday, October 16, for the purpose of discussing the above subject and any other matters that might be presented.
