The Council met in regular session on Monday, November 5 and was called to order at 8.05 o'clock P.M.

Present : Mayor Eversole, Atty. Bettis, Supt. Dunn, Fire Chief Christiansen, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Hulbert, Kraft, Oathes and Pond.

The minutes of the October 15th. meeting were read and approved. Mayor Eversole then stated that he would hear from any visitors present, if they so desired.

Whereupon Ben Oilar entered very strenuous objections as to his assessment for sewer charges, insisting that he was being assessed more that others, with with the same measurements of ground. The method used in assessing his property was explained to him and no other action taken.

Mr. P.E.Asmunstad then addressed the Council, stating that his Maple Lane property had been left in bad condition by the sewer contractors and thought they should remove the rocks at their own expense. He also again stated that, in his opinion, the bill of \$ 128.00 for grading by the City equipment was excessive, but that he would be willing to pay the sum of \$ 80.00, his previous offer.

Whereupon on motion by Anderson, seconded by Hulbert and carried, it was voted that the previous action of the Council, as of Sept. 17-1956, be rescinded and that the sum of \$ 80.00 be accepted for payment in full of the above mentioned claim.

## Communications

From Southern Pacific Co. asking if the City is interested in taking over its water tank in Canby.

From Mrs. Mauthe relative to some damages account sewer installation. Atty. Bettis letter relative to Torgeson garbage contract.

The Recorder then presented to the Council an old (1908) Zion Cemetery deed to Lot 14, Block 4 in the name of --Tecker, the same having been left by Mrs. Irene 0'Dell of Molalla, a daughter of said Tecker, and who wished to sell back to the City the portion of the unused lot.

In this connection, it was moved by Beck, seconded by Pond and carried, that Mrs. O'Dell be advised it was contrary to the rules and regulations to repurchase any lots or parts of lots, nor could they be sold to others, but must be returned to the Cemetery at the original price paid.

Earl Oliver then addressed the Council relative to the extension of Wait Avenue, thro' his property, to Washington street, from Ferry Road. He stated that he would be willing to dedicate to the City, a 60 foot street, but as he expected to sell off lots in the future, did not care to assume any sewer assessments at this time. After some discussion in the matter, it was moved by Oathes, seconded by Beck and carried, that it be referred to the Planning Commission for their consideration.

## Reports

Fire Chief Christiansen reported one city fire and seven rural calls between October 6 and 30; all small and no damages mentioned. Also seven ambulance calls and financial statement showing bank balance of \$ 1858.37

Police report by Chief Younce showed gas used in car, 180 gals-mileage 1212; and the usual activities, with nothing special occuring.

Supt, Yoder for the Cemetery reported receipts for the montho of \$ 460.00, covering sale of lots and charges for openings.

The Recorder reported eight cases in his court, with fines aggregating \$270.00, costs \$57.50 -net \$212.50.

The idea of clearing off more of the cemetery property was then bro't up and discussed, but it was decided to postpone any action until the next meeting.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Kraft and carried, that the Mayor appoint a committee to draw up a sanitary code and report back to the Council, when an ordinance could then be introduced . Com ?

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Oathes and carried, that the City Atty. be requested to draw an ordinance setting up a perpetual care fund for the Cemetery.

## Ordinance No. 395

The above ordinance coming up for final action, it was moved by Oathes, seconded by Beck and carried, after being read by Atty Bettis, that it be placed on its final passage. On roll call-Yeas 6, Nays 0.

Atty. Bettis reported \_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_ secured sewer easement from Wesenberg and Sandsness in Block 16.

It was then moved by Oathes, seconded by Kraft and carried, that"change order" No. 2 be approved and signed by the Mayor and Recorder.

It was also moved by Oathes, seconded by Anderson and carried, that change order No. 3 be approved and signed by the Mayor and Recorder.

It was then moved by Anderson, seconded by Beck and carried, that the City Atty. and Supt. Dunn draw up recommendations for work orders to be used in future work of the sewer contractors.
