

Regular Meeting  
Monday November 19-1956

The Council met in regular session on Monday, November 19, 1956 and was called to order at 8.10 P.M., with the following present: Mayor Eversole, City Atty. Bettis, Supt. Dunn, the Recorder and Councilmen-Anderson, Beck, Hulbert, Oathes and Pond.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of Nov. 5 and the specials of Nov. 8 and 15 were read and approved, after a correction in the minutes of Nov. 5, relative to a proposed re-sale of lots by Mrs. O'Dell

Communications

Letter from Melvin Heilman, stating that he is unable to pay any sewer assessment against his Canby property and suggests that it will be necessary for the City to sell it.

Communication from the State Highway Department under date of Nov. 5, to the effect that, in their opinion, no benefit would arise from installing an advance flashing beacon for the Elm Street intersection, but that some benefit would obtain from the installation of a flashing beacon on the advance " Signals Ahead " sign, which would aid southbound traffic approaching the Ivy Street intersection; also stating that the Department would proceed with the installation at its own expense.

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From the Canby Roller Rink by Kenneth Doney, asking permission to place two 50 gal stove oil barrels along side of the Legion Building next to City Park .

It was then moved by Pond, seconded by Oathes and carried, that the above request of Mr. Doney be granted, with the understanding that they will be removed in the spring before start of Park activities.

It was then moved by Oathes, seconded by Beck and carried, that the State liquor license application of the Rose Cafe be approved.

Ordinance No. 396

The above numbered ordinance to amend and correct the sewer assessment roll as set forth in Ord. No. 395 was then introduced, read for the first time, ordered posted and to come up for final action on December 6, 1956. Roll call-Yeas 5, nays 0)

On motion by Pond, seconded by Anderson and carried it was voted to hold a special meeting on December 6 for the purpose of acting on Ordinance No. 396 and any other business that may properly come before the Council.

It then appearing that sewer assessment (\$468.27) of Jos. Harris on parts of Lots 18 & 19 exceeds the assessed value of the property involved \$(280.00) , on motion by Oathes, seconded by Beck and carried, it was voted to allow him 6 months time in which to pay the excess difference Amounting to \$ 188.27.

It was then moved by Hulbert, seconded by Anderson and carried, that the services of Mrs. Earl Oliver be continued through the months December and January and February, when needed, and at a wage of \$ 1.30 per hour.

The matter of the Wesenberg sewer easement then coming up for discussion, and Mr. Wesenberg be unwilling to attend this meeting, on motion, seconded and carried, Atty. Bettis was asked to take time out to confer with him at his residence.

On his return, Atty. Bettis reported that Wesenberg had signified his willingness to grant additional easement thro' his property.

Whereupon, it was moved by Beck, seconded by Hulbert and carried, that Mr. Bettis attend to the necessary arrangements and that the Recorder be instructed to draw a warrant for the sum of \$ 68.47 in favor of Wm. J. & Oleva M. Wesenberg in payment thereof. On roll call, Yeas 5-nays 0 .

It then appearing that Ed. Krueger and Mrs. D.A. Warner, joint owners of Lot 4-Block 3, were objecting to the assessment for two sewer hook-ups to their building, there being but one outlet at this time, it was moved by Beck, seconded by Oathes and carried, that, for the present, only the one charge be made, but if later it became advisable to install another connection, the usual charge would prevail.

Mayor then reminded the Council that the City should employ another electrician and in connection thereof, the wage and salary committee, after a short session came back with the following recommendations:

To advertise and hire an apprentice lineman at 1.90 per hour and that the City assume the expense of his enrolment in a school for apprentices.

The Committee also recommended that the salary of Clayton Yoder be raised \$ 10.00 per month, dating from October first 1956.

Whereupon, on motion by Oathes, seconded by Pond and carried, the above recommendations were approved and so ordered.

It was then moved by Pond, seconded by Oathes and carried, that the request of the Planning Commission, that the City allow the sum of not to exceed \$ 100 for plans and specifications for rest rooms in the Wait Park bldg-be approved.

Mayor Eversole then stated that at this time he would like to mention the following appointments on the City Planning Commission:

Gordon Weygandt 4 year term from 8-1-1955

Earl Oliver 4 year term from 8-1-56

John Wilson Beck 4 Year term from 8-1-56

Councilman Pond, Chairman of the Cemetery committee then brought up the advisability of removing the grove of trees in the cemetery, which matter had been discussed at a previous meeting.

After a more or less heated discussion on the subject, the Council being divided in their opinions, it was moved and seconded to table same until the next meeting.

This action, however was defeated and it was then moved and seconded to adjourn, which was also defeated.

Whereupon, the argument was resumed, but with no agreement in sight, another motion to adjourn was made, seconded and carried. Time 12.15 A.M.
