In Re: Recommendations of Canby City Planning Commission

Gentlemen:

As ex-officio member of the Canby City Planning Commission and acting Secretary at the regular meeting of the Commission held on December 20, 1955, I have been directed by a motion duly made, seconded, and passed before said Commission, to advise the Honorable Mayor and Council that it is the recommendation of the Planning Commission that the Council should act on the offer of Mr. Allison, as tendered through the City Engineer, and which said offer was to convey to the City ten feet of Mr. Allison's land and for the purpose of extending North Cedar Street. It was further recommended that the acceptance of Mr. Allison's tendered deed be conditioned on the receipt of a deed from the School Board of Clackamas County School District 86, conveying to the City for street purposes 50 feet of land adjacent to that offered by Mr. Allison, and which said 50 feet is presently owned by the School Board, having been acquired recently from Mr. Leland Hardisty. By the acquiring of these parcels of land, a 60 foot wide street can be opened by the City, extending North Cedar Street.

It was further recommended by the Commission that it is the Commission's recommendation that if and when the afore mentioned property is acquired, the City Council then moved without delay to vacate that portion of Elm Street and for the approximate distance of 300 feet north of the North Line of Fifth Street, and all pursuant to the formal request of the School Board submitted to the Council at an earlier date.

The following motion was then made by Anderson, seconded by Hulbert and carried: Moved that the City Council initiate a Sanitary Sewer Improvement project within the Canby City limits and basically in accordance with plans previously considered by the Council and as prepared by the engineering firm of Cornell, Howland, Hayes and Merryfield, and which project shall be paid for, in part, by special assessments against the property especialy benefitted thereby; and that the City Engineer make a survey and written report of such proposed project and file the same with the City Recorder no later than 8 o'clock P.M., February 6, 1956, and which report shall conform to the requirements of Ordinance No. 393 .
